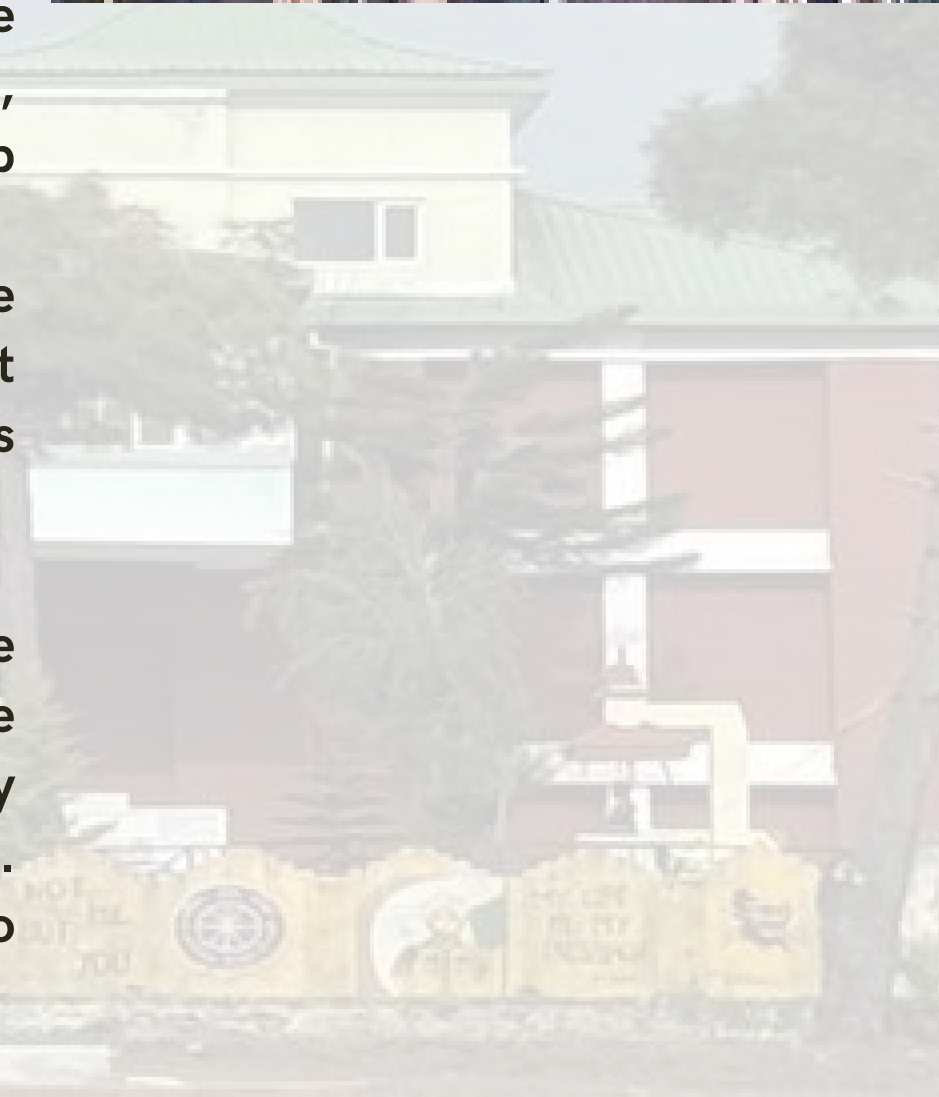
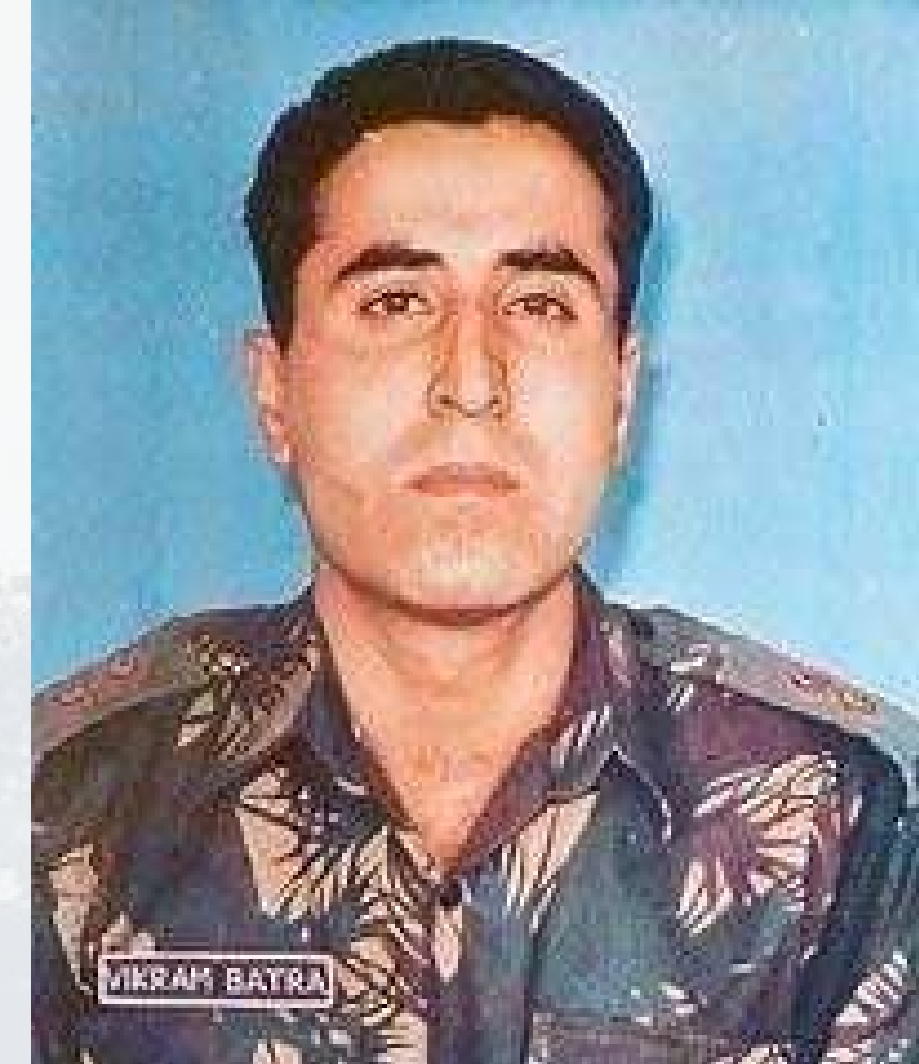
ABOUT CAPTAIN VIKRAM BATRA

Captain Vikram Batra was born on 9 September 1974 in Ghuggar village near Palampur, Himachal Pradesh, to Sh. G.L.Batra and Late Smt. Kamal Batra. He got his primary education from his mother, who herself was a teacher. He received his education up to Middle Standard at the D.A.V. Public School in Palampur. After passing 10+2 in 1992 from Central School Palampur, he got admitted in D.A.V. College, Chandigarh in B.Sc. where he was adjudged the best N.C.C. Cadet (Air Wing) in two zones. Later, he was selected to join the Indian Military Academy in Dehradun in 1996 in Jessore Company of Manekshaw Battalion, and was commissioned in the Indian Army as a Lieutenant of the 13 Jammu & Kashmir Rifles at Sopore, in Jammu & Kashmir. He rose to the rank of Captain.

On the eruption of a war-like situation in Kargil, Dross and Batalik sub-sectors in July 1999, Captain Vikram Batra was sent along with his company on the first strategic and daring operation to recapture the first peak of utmost importance- Point 5140, which was at an altitude of 17,000 feet. Captain Vikram Batra, 13 JAK Rifles, and his Delta Company was given the task of recapturing Point 5140. Nick named Sher Shah ('Lion King') in Hindi for his courage, he decided to lead from the rear, as an element of surprise would help stupefy the enemy. He and his men ascended the sheer rock-cliff, but as the group neared the top, the enemy pinned them on the face of the bare cliff with machine gunfire.

Captain Batra, along with five of his men, climbed up regardless and after reaching the top, hurled two grenades at the machine gun post. He single-handedly killed three enemy soldiers in close combat. He was seriously injured during this, but insisted on regrouping his men to continue with the mission. Inspired by the courage displayed by Captain Batra, the soldiers of 13 JAK Rifles charged the enemy position and captured Point 5140 at 3:30 a.m. on 20 June 1999.

He attained martyrdom when he tried to rescue an injured officer during an enemy counter attack against Point 4875 in the early morning hours of 7 July 1999. For his sustained display of the most conspicuous personal bravery and leadership of the highest order in the face of the enemy, Captain Vikram Batra was awarded the Param Vir Chakra, India's highest military honor on 15 August 1999, the 52nd anniversary of India's independence. To shower the respect to the great patriot, the H.P. Government has rechristened this College to Saheed Captain Vikram Batra Government College, Palampur. We are proud to announce that the college has always tried to live up to the expectations desired by the society and the students.

Message from the PGDCA Coordinator

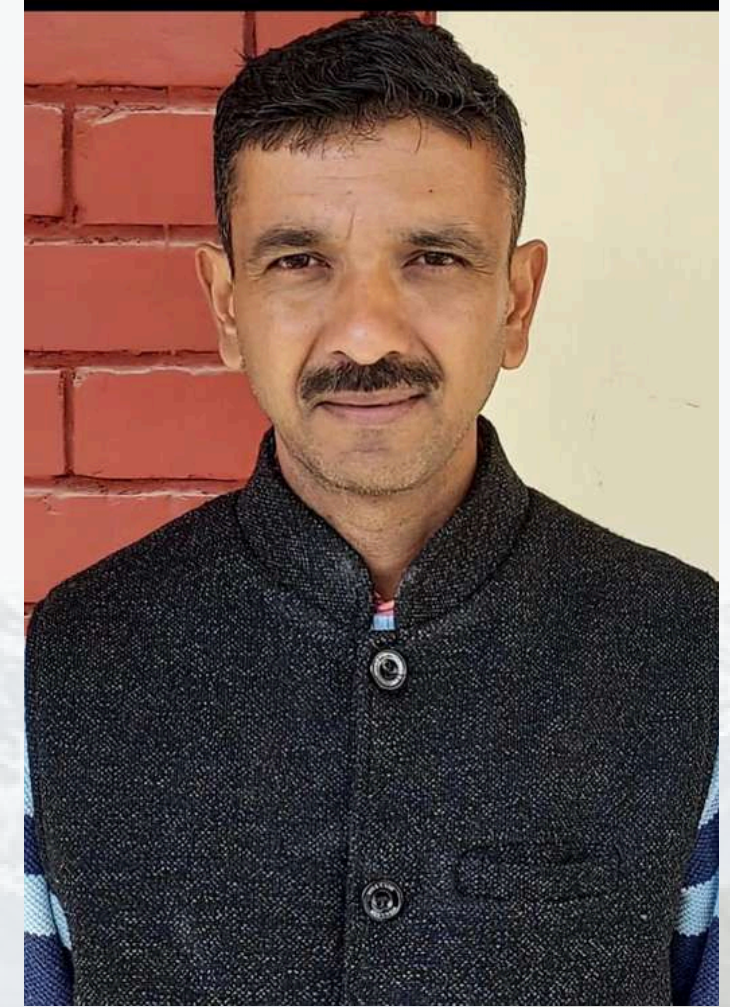

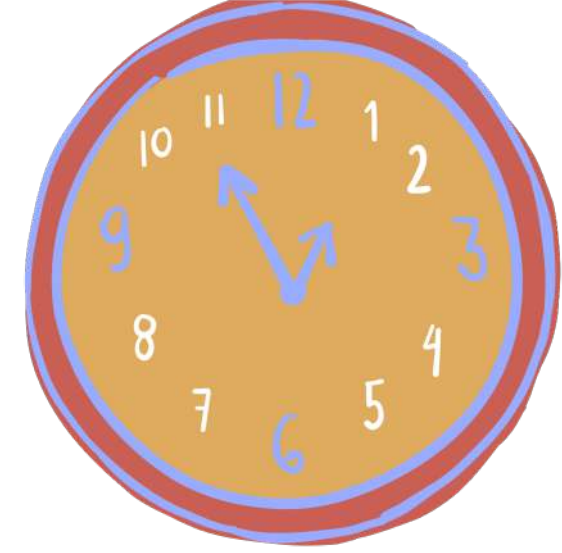

COURSE, ELIGIBILITY, AGE LIMIT AND BASIS OF ADMISSION



Course Details

Both Bachelor of Business Administration(BBA) and Bachelor of Computer Application(BCA)are three year Degree Courses having Semester system of examination spread over six semesters under Self-Financing scheme. The distribution of seats for both the courses is as under:

1. Eligibility:

Plus two examination in any discipline under 10 + 2 scheme or any other examination equivalent thereto, of Board/University established by law in India with at least 40% marks {35% marks for SC/ST category}.

2.Age Limit:

Maximum age limit for admission to BBA & BCA course is 21 years for the general category, 24 years for SC/ST category and 23 years for the girl candidates as on 1st July of the year concerned. The Vice Chancellor may permit age relaxation upto maximum of three months.

NEP 2020

The structure and duration of undergraduate programmes of study proposed by the NEP 2020 include:

1. Undergraduate programmes of either 3 or 4 year duration with multiple entry and exit option with appropriate certifications.
2. A certificate after completing one year (2 Semesters) of study in the chosen discipline or field , including vocational and professional areas.
3. A diploma after two years (4 semesters) of study in the chosen discipline or field , including vocational and professional areas.
4. A Bachelor's degree after 3-years (6 semesters) programme of study in the chosen discipline or field , including vocational and professional areas.

Subsidized seats	40
Non-Subsidizedseats	20

One seat is reserved for single girl child(SGC).

BASIS OF ADMISSION

Subsidized Seats:

The admission to both BBA and BCA will be purely on the basis of merit obtained in 10+2 class from CBSE / ICSE / HP Board of School Education or any other equivalent board recognized by Govt. of India.

Non-Subsidized Seats:

This scheme admits students as per the merit examination. The candidate seeking admission under non-subsidized category must mark "Yes" on the admission form. After filling the seats in the subsidized category, top 20 candidates as per the merit list, who have applied separately for non-subsidized category will be admitted in this category.

In addition to the eligibility conditions mentioned above (under subsidized category), NRIs/NRI Sponsored/ Foreign nationals shall be required to submit along with the application form, the following documents as may be applicable for category of their candidature.

A. Proof of nationality is case of Foreign Nationals.

B. Proof of their status in the case of NRI's. For this purpose, either of the following documents shall be considered as a proof.

(i) Copy of Non-resident card/Employment card issued by the employer.

(ii) Photocopy of the immigration card/employment VISA entry on the passport along with details of the passport.

(iii) Certificate issued by the Indian Embassy/High Commission in the country where NRI is residing.

C. Certificate of sponsorship from NRI in the case of a sponsored candidate, along with proof of NRI status of the sponsor required under para (B)

RESERVATIONS

(Ordinance 3.1)

A. Photocopy of the latest assessment order of the Income-tax authorities in India and the Permanent Account number (PAN) of the sponsor issued by the Income Tax Department.

B. Two self addressed envelopes of size 28X13 cm bearing stamps for Rs.6 or in the case of Foreign addressee stamps of required amount should be affixed by the applicant. Admission to the courses except for seats reserved for NRI's/NRI sponsored and foreign students shall be subject to the following conditions:

C. 15% and 7.5% seats shall be reserved for Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe candidates respectively, who have passed their qualifying examination from H.P. Board of School Education, or any other school located within the territorial jurisdiction of Himachal Pradesh affiliated to any other Education Board e.g. CBSE or ICSE board etc. However, reservation of seats will be governed by notification of the Government from time to time.

RESERVATIONS

(Ordinance 3.1)

(D) The remaining 77.5% seats shall be filled as under:-

(i) 25% of the seats for admission to the course shall be open for all the candidates irrespective of the institution from which they have passed their qualifying examination.

(ii) 75% of seats shall be filled out of the candidates who have passed their qualifying examination from H.P. Board of School Education or any other school located within territorial jurisdiction of Himachal Pradesh affiliated to any other Education Board

e.g. CBSE or ICSE Board etc. subject to the following reservation:

(a) 5% of all seats shall be reserved for outstanding sportsmen.

(b) 5% of the seats shall be reserved for the outstanding cultural activists.

(c) 5% of the seats shall be reserved for specially abled candidates.

RESERVATIONS (Ordinance 3.1)

E. Provided that the minimum eligibility for admission to the course in case of SC/ST will be 5% lower than the eligibility conditions for other candidates.

The admission to these reserved seats as stated at {a), {b) & {c) to para {ii) of clause (B) above shall be made as per procedure/rules approved by the Executive Council from time to time.

(NOTE: Any change in the reservation of seats as per the notification of the H.P. Govt. or HPU Shimla will be implemented from the date of notification.)

OR

200 points roster of H.P. University showing reservation of various categories for admissions shall be followed.

NOTE: Roster for admission will be as per the latest notification of H.P. Govt/HPU Shimla .

Application form duly filled and accompanying the following documents should be filled online after registering through

www.gcpalampur.ac.in :

{i} Certificates of Matriculation or its equivalent examination and PlusTwo {10+2} or its equivalent examination with the conversion formula of grade into percentage where ever applicable with relevant testimonials.

{ii} Proof of date of birth {Matriculation Certificate}.

{iii} Latest Character Certificate and a copy of AadharCard.

{v} Certificate of reserve category.

The candidate will have to produce the original certificates along with their self attested photocopies and should be accompanied by the parents (Father or Mother) at the time of Counseling..

Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Application

In order to cater to the growing demand of computer awareness among the youth, this college has introduced a Post graduate diploma in computer applications (PGDCA) from this academic session 2026-27.

The duration of PGDCA course is One-year spread over two semesters. The examination will be held at the end of each semester

Eligibility Conditions

Any graduate from recognized university or its equivalent with at least 50% marks(45% marks in case of SC/ST candidates).

Age Limit

The maximum age limit for the candidate seeking admission to PGDCA programme shall be 26 years for male candidates,28 years for female candidates and 29 years for SC/ST candidates as on 1st July of the admission year or the age limit decided by HP government or by HPU time to time.

Admission Criteria

The admission to PGDCA course will be on the basis of merit drawn in graduation. If number of candidate is three times or more than the no. of seat then entrance test will be held of 50 marks.

- 1.** 15% and 7.5% seats shall be reserved for schedule caste and schedule tribe candidates respectively who have passed their B.Sc / B.Com Or any other equivalent degree from any recognized university.
- 2.** The remaining 77.5% seats shall be filled as under:
 - (i)** 25% of the seats for admission shall be open for all the candidates irrespective of the institution from where they have passed their qualifying examination.
 - (ii)** 75% of the seats shall be filled out of the candidates who have passed their graduation degree from Himachal Pradesh University subjected to the following reservations:
 - (a)** 5% of the seats shall be reserved for outstanding sportsmen/women.
 - (b)** 5% of the seats shall be reserved for outstanding cultural activists.
 - (c)** 3% of the seats shall be reserved for physically handicapped candidates.
 - (d)** Reservation will be applicable as per HPU govt. and HPU norms.
 - (e)** The Roster system will be followed strictly.

The H.P. University 120 Point roster for admission showing reservations of various categories shall also be followed as per norms.

Admission Dates

The online registration for PGDCA students (2026-27) will commence from 22 June, 2026.

Self Financing Students (Non –Subsidized Category)

This applies only to NRI's/NRI sponsored/Foreign Nationals/Payment category. This scheme admits students as per the merit in the examination passed by the candidates. Top 20 Candidates who had applied in this category shall be admitted.

In addition to the eligibility conditions mentioned above, a candidates shall be required to submit along with the application form, anyone of the following documents as may be applicable for the category of their candidature.

1.Proof of nationality in case of Foreign Nationals.1.Proof of their status in the case of NRI's. For this purpose, either of the following documents shall be considered as a proper proof:

- (i)**Copy of Non-resident card/employment card issued by the employer.
- (ii)**Photocopy of the immigration card/employment VISA entry on the passport along with the details of the passport.
- (iii)**Certificate issued by the Indian Embassy/High Commission in the country where the NRI is residing.
- (iv)**Photocopy of the latest assessment order of income tax authorities either in India or the country of employment filed in the status of NRI.

1. Certificate of sponsorship from NRI in the case of a sponsored candidate along with a proof of NRI status of the sponsored required under para (B)

(i) Photocopy of the latest assessment order of the Income Tax authorities in India and the permanent account number (PAN) of the sponsor issued by the income tax department.

Candidates granted admission under self-financing scheme shall be required to pay an annual consolidated key of US \$550(Five hundred and fifty US Dollars) in case of foreign National of NRIs and Rs. 25000/- in case of NRI sponsored/ Non subsidized candidates. Their dues have to be submitted at the time of admission.

Note

1. Fees will be paid in two installments.

2. The student admitted will be governed by the rules and regulation mentioned in the prospectus.

CONTINUOUS COMPREHENSIVE ASSESSMENT {CCA}

This would have the following components:

(A) Classroom Attendance (i) Each student will have to attend a minimum of 75% Lectures/Tutorials/ Practicals. A student having less than 75% attendance will not be allowed to appear in the End Semester Examination (ESE)/ Practicals.

(ii) Those having between 74% and 65% attendance will apply for exemption in a prescribed form accompanied by clear reason(s) for absence to the head of the institution.

(iii) Those having between 64% and 50% attendance will apply for exemption in a prescribed form accompanied by a Medical Certificate from a Government Hospital to the head of the institution.

(iv) The exemption from 75% attendance will be given to those participating in prescribed co-curricular activities (e.g. NCC, NSS, Youth Festivals, Sports etc.) to the extent of 25%. However the condition of 50% attendance will be compulsory in these cases. The claim for this exemption should be supported by authenticated certificate from the concerned authorities.

(v) The candidates those getting the exemptions, except for those getting exemptions for co-curricular activities, will not be entitled for getting the CCA marks for classroom attendance as given below.

(B) Classroom Attendance Incentive: The incentive for the classroom attendance (for those participating in Co- curricular activities, 25% will be added to percent attendance) will be awarded CCA marks as follows:-

= 75% but < 80% 1 mark; = 80% but < 85% 2 marks; = 85 but < 90% 3 marks; = 90% but < 95% 4 marks and > 95% 5 marks

(C) Mid-Term (Minor) Tests (i) There will be two mid-term tests, first after 48 teaching days (8 weeks) covering the syllabus covered so far, and second after 90 teaching days (15 weeks) covering the syllabus after the first minor test. Each of these mid-term tests will be for 15 marks. The stationary for the minor tests, e.g. the 20-page test booklet, will be provided by the college/ Department as the case may be, for which fee may be charged.

(ii) Question paper for the minor tests will be made by the teacher of the course and will be evaluated by him/ her. If more than one teachers are teaching the course, they will set paper on rotation basis

END SEMESTER EXAMINATION (ESE)

(ii) Evaluated test booklets will be provided to the students (shown in the class) and they can be given photocopies of the same for the cost of photocopying and the administrative effort involved. The amount chargeable will be determined by the college administration.

(iii) In laboratory courses (having only practical (P) component), the students will be tested on the basis of laboratory exercises given by the course teacher concerned. Rest of the procedure will remain the same as above.

For the Correspondence Courses and Distance Education Courses (through the ICDEOL of the HPU) the same can be done in an on-line mode through e-mail or other electronic mediums as per Distance Education Council, New Delhi guidelines

(D) Seminar/ Assignment/ Term Paper the remaining 15 marks of the CCA will be awarded on the basis of seminar/ assignment/ term paper etc. that the course teacher might give to the students. For the Correspondence Courses and Distance Education Courses (through the ICDEOL of the HPU) the same can be done in an on-line mode through e-mail or other electronic mediums as per Distance Education Council, New Delhi guidelines and the best practices for distance education mode or on the basis of well designed written assignments by post.

The remaining 50% of the final grade of the student in a course will be on the basis of an end-semester examination (ESE) that will be for three hours duration and will be covering the whole syllabus of the course.

(i) For the Odd Semesters the ESE will be in the month of October/ November and for Even Semesters it will be in the month of April/ May (as decided by H.P. University).

(ii) A candidate who does not pass the examination (ESE) in any course(s) (or due to some reason is not able to appear in the ESE, other conditions being fulfilled, and so is considered as 'Fail'), shall be permitted to appear in such failed course(s)' ESE in the subsequent ESE to be held in the following October/ November or April/ May as the case may be.

(iii) The registration for the ESE will be done at the time of the enrollment for the course at the beginning of the semester. The fee for the ESE will also be collected at that time as decided by the university from time to time.

(iv) If a student is not permitted to appear in the ESE due to shortage of attendance beyond the exemption limit (< 50% attendance) shall be deemed to have 'dropped' the course. However such candidate, on his/ her written request to be made immediately, can be permitted to redo the missed semester after completing the rest of the programme or whenever the course is offered subsequently. This redoing would mean complete course including CCA and ESE.

DRESS CODE

CODE OF CONDUCT AND GENERAL RULES

- Each student is expected to observe the college dress code strictly.
- Each student is expected to be present regularly in the College (Except during leave).
- Name will be struck-off if the candidate remains absent continuously for 6 days. Candidate can seek re-admission after satisfying the Principal for the absence within 6 days. However, it is the discretion of the Principal to refuse the admission (**First Re-admission Fee is Rs. 200/- and Second Re-admission fee is Rs. 300/- within 7 days only that too in the presence of parents**). After that no re-admission is allowed.
- No student is allowed to put poster in College campus/notice board, and to hold assembly in college premises or to address an unauthorized gathering on the college campus.
- Silence is to be strictly observed. Students causing disturbance/Obstruction in the smooth functioning are liable for disciplinary action.
- The students causing loss to the College property will be penalized and asked to make good for the loss.



- For other rules/regulations the students are directed to consult the College Prospectus and H.P. University Ordinance.
- The use of Mobile Phones or any other type of electronic gadgets is strictly prohibited. The defaulters will be severely dealt with and fine up to **Rs. 500/-** may be imposed on them.
- No student is authorized to accompany/come with an outsider in the College premises. The defaulters will be sternly punished along with fine and outsider will be handed over to Police.
- The College does not take the responsibility for postal delay or loss of any document and letter in transit.
- Suppression of any information or furnishing any false information by a candidate will lead to immediate cancellation of his/her admission at any time. In such cases fee paid shall not be refunded.
- The information given is an indication of the College/University's plans as on date of publication of this document. Details can be modified from time to time for academic and operational reasons. The students will be governed by latest regulations applicable to them.
- In the event of any inconsistency in the rules for admissions/examinations or in the event of any clarification with respect to above said rules/instructions or any other matter, the decision of the Vice-Chancellor/Principal shall be final and no claim, what so ever, shall be entertained.

HOSTEL

The college has a Girls Hostel with a capacity of 105 girls. Preference will be given to the students belonging to SC category. Interested students may apply on the prescribed performa available in the office.

CURBING RAGGING IN THE INSTITUTE

Ragging in institute is strictly banned according to the judgement and directions of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, Himachal Pradesh University and guidelines issued by UGC in this regards. The following guidelines will be observed to prevent of ragging in the institute.

- Every candidate seeking admission will give undertaking duly printed on the application form that he/ she will not indulge in ragging and if found guilty he/she will be liable punishment. Similar undertaking will be obtained from the parents/guardian of the applicant.
- Anti Ragging committees has been constituted in the College.
- Whenever a ragging incident is brought to the notice of the College authorities, the disciplinary committee will hold an enquiry in to the incident.
- 1.If any student is found guilty of ragging, after the enquiry then he/she will be punished accordingly. The punishment may include:-
 - i) Expulsion from the college
 - ii) Suspension from the classes
 - iii) Fine with a public apology
 - iv)Withholding scholarship or other benefits
 - v) Debarring from the representation in events.
 - vi) Suspension or expulsion from hostel or mess.
 - vii) Legal proceeding under criminal law shall be initiated.

- If any student is found guilty of ragging incident occurred in the past then he/she may be expelled from the institution.
- As per the judgement of the Hon'ble Supreme Court delivered on 8th May, 2009 and UGC/AICTE Regulations that all the students will have to fill an Anti-Ragging undertaking every year. The undertaking can be filled online at www.antiragging.in or www.amanmovement.org.
