

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An Introduction – Historical Perspective

Shaheed Captain Vikram Batra Govt. College, Palampur (Kangra) came into existence as Govt. College Palampur vide Govt. of Himachal Pradesh, Education Department Notification No. *Chha(15)*, *3/86-Shiksha ka-II Dated 07-04-1995*. Later it was renamed in the memory of Capt. Vikram Batra (Param Veer Chakra) the martyr and Hero of Kargil war, 1999. The College was recognized by UGC under section 2(f) & 12(B) of the UGC Act. 1956, vide latter No. *8-471/2008(CPP-I) dated 29 Sep., 2009*.

Shershah of Kargil War – Amar Sahid CaptainVikram Batra, PVC, who at the age of 24 sacrificed his life for the Nation during Kargil war in 1999, is remembered by every Indian for his valour, courage and leadership qualities. Captain Vikram Batra was born on 9th September, 1974 to Sh G L Batra and Smt. Kamal Kanta Batra in Palampur. After completing his education, he joined IMA, Dehradun and was commissioned as a Lieutenant of the 13 J & K Rifles at Sopore in Baramullah. Due to heroics of Captain Batra, India recaptured most significant peak – point 5140 from illegal possession of Pakistani soldiers in June 1999 followed by point 4750 and point 4875. While dragging Lt. Naveen back under cover, Naveen pleaded to Captain Batra to let him continue the fight in spite the injuries to which Captain Batra replied "Tu baal bachedaar hai!! Hatt jaa peeche," ("You have kids and wife to look after! Get back!"). He sacrificed his life during this rescue operation on July 7, 1999. He was awarded PVC on 15th August, 1999 posthumously. Last words of Captain Vikram Batra were the battle cry —Jai Mata Dil. His quote — Ye Dil Maange More! swept across the country and remains popular with millions of Indians & became a symbol of the indomitable spirit of Indian patriotism and Valour. "Ya toh Tiranga lehrake awunga, ya fir Tirange mein lipta huwa chala awunga, lekin awunga zaroor" (Either I will come back after hoisting the Tricolour (Indian flag), or I will come back wrapped in it, but I will be back for sure).

Since its inception, the college has built up an impressive array of academic facilities and continuously adding more jewels into its academic basket. At present it is imparting education for both Graduate and Post-Graduate students in different disciplines. Besides this, it has hostel facilities to students who come from far flung areas of the region, Personality Development & Career Guidance Cell, sports and athletic activities, separate NCC units for boys and girls, two units of National Social Service Scheme (NSS) and one unit of Rovers and Rangers. Red-Ribbon Club of the college is spreading COVID awareness among the students and society. The Parent-Teachers Association is an inalienable part of the college and is always assisting the college administration. The college has one IT lab with more than 3 dozens computers having an access to Internet leased line of 100mbps bandwidth, a computer lab for BCA students and a separate computer lab for science students, one Language Lab with 20 computers, 16 well equipped Smart Class Rooms and well equipped science labs. All units of college are connected through high speed internet facility. The firefighting system has been also installed in the college premises. The college can boast of having various societies, clubs and cells which endeavor to enrich the academic and extra-curricular strands

of our students. The college has excelled not only in academic activities but also distinguished itself in sports and cultural activities as well.

The college is affiliated to Himachal Pradesh University, Summer Hill, Shimla-5. Besides current courses such as B.A., B. Com., B.Sc., B.C.A., B.B.A. and M.A. (Eco), the college will add few more gems in the field of education in form of Add-On courses and Post Graduations in near future.

How to Apply For Admission Through Online Mode

Note: All NEW CANDIDATES must register in the college website before they apply for admission. However, OLD STUDENTS could take admission after logging in with their IDs. The students are advised to go through "General Admission Rules" mentioned in prospectus. While registration/Logging in, they will be prompted to make a payment for the registration/prospectus fee.

New students seeking admission in **first year can apply for** three courses (Combinations) in order of preference in the application form. Student will be then allotted one of these courses (Combinations) on the basis of merit. The

course allotted will be intimated through e-mail and you will have to deposit the fee (online) within the stipulated time. All the admission will be provisional subject to final approval by the HP University & SPU Mandi.

The Old Students seeking admission in 2nd and 3rd Year will continue with same combination. The Generic Courses will be allotted on the basis of merit after the admission process is over. All the admissions will be provisional subject to final approval by the university. Old students must mention their university registration number and upload photocopies of receipt of 2nd fee installment paid by them as well as admit card of previous class.

Note:

- Be careful while filling the information such as choices etc. Form once submitted, cannot be edited.
- Keep checking your Login account for payment link of FEE and your email for fee message on regular basis.
- Submit the signed Hard Copy of Admission Form along with documents to the concerned committee after online submission for verification.

Before applying candidate must keep following documents/particulars handy:

- 1. A valid own Mobile number. Please keep it active, at least until the admission process is complete, as all communication will be sent through SMS/email.
- 2. Mobile number must belong to the candidate himself/herself or someone in the family. Do not fill in friend's or Cyber Cafe's Mobile number.
- 3. An e-mail ID belonging to the candidate or someone in the family.
- 4. Recent passport size photograph scanned in 150 x 190-pixel resolution and less than 250 Kb in size.
- 5. UID Aadhaar number or Enrolment number.
- 6. SC/ST candidates who want to apply for scholarship must have a valid Aadhaar linked Bank Account with core banking facility. Please keep handy Bank Account number, Branch Name and Branch IFSC Code.
- 7. Detailed Marks Card of previous examination passed.
- 8. University Registration Number of candidates who are already registered with the University
- 9. Candidates willing to apply for Reservation must have a valid supporting document.
- 10. Candidates, whose name appears in the Cut-off list or to whom SMS or email for counseling is sent, must bring the original documents and their



- photo copies at the time of counseling.
- 11. In the Registration Section, please select the Course and Semester/Year in which you are seeking admission. Subject selection will be visible after you successfully register and Login into portal.
- 12. It is advised to regularly check email, SMS and visit College site for latest updates over admission process.

Instructions for New Students (First Year)

- All the new students seeking admission in the college will have to register themselves on the online admission portal.
- In the application form you can apply for three different DSC1 courses (Combinations) in order of preference. You will be allotted one of these courses (Combinations) on the basis of merit of previous year i.e. 10+2 marks. The merit list will be made separately for each DSC1 course as there are limited numbers of seats in each DSC1 so while selecting different combination you can choose different DSC1 in the order of preference. The course allotted will be intimated through e-mail/SMS and you will have to deposit the fee (online) within the stipulated time. All the admission will be provisional subject to final approval by the university.

Subject Change: Once the candidate is admitted to First Year, he/she will be allowed to change the subject only if the percentage of candidate is more than or equal to the cut off percentage in desired subject and availability of seat in that course.

Examples:

• **B.Sc.** (Non-Medical): Suppose you want to apply for the combination Physics, Mathematics and Chemistry and your order of preference of DSC1 is *1. Physics 2. Mathematics and 3. Chemistry*. Then in the form you can choose Physics as DSC1 in the first combination, Mathematics as DSC1 in the second combination and Chemistry as DSC1 in the third combination. If you get the first choice i.e. Physics then your name will not be considered for the rest of two combinations and if you get the second preference your name



- will not be considered in the third option. The other courses i.e. DSC2 /DSE3 etc. can be chosen from the allowed combinations from the scroll down list.
- **B.Sc.** (Medical): Suppose you want to apply for the combination Botany, Zoology and Chemistry and your order of preference of DSC1 is *1. Zoology 2. Botany and 3. Chemistry*. Then in the form you can choose Zoology as DSC1 I the first combination, Botany as DSC1 in second combination and Chemistry as DSC1 in the third combination. If you get the first choice i.e. Zoology then your name will not be considered for the rest of two combinations and if you get the second preference your name will not be considered in the third option. The other courses i.e. DSC2 /DSE3 etc can be chosen from the allowed combinations from the scroll down list.
- **B.A.:** Suppose your choice for DSC1 is History, Political Science and Geography in the order for preference then in the form you can choose History as DSC1 in the first option, Political Science as DSC1 in the second option and Geography as DSC1 in the third option. If your name appears in the merit list of History then it will not be considered in the other two and if it appears in the merit list of Political Science then it will not be considered in third subject. The other courses i.e. DSC2 etc. can be chosen from the allowed combinations from the scroll down list.
- **B.Com./BCA/BBA/M.A.**: In these classes only one combination is available.

Instructions for Old Students (2nd and 3rd Year)

- All the old students seeking admission in the college will log into the College admission portal.
- Students should choose all the courses (DSC's) very carefully, which he/she has studied in the previous class. All the admission will be provisional subject to final approval by the university. For the final year students GE courses will be allotted on the basis of merit.
- It will be mandatory for all the students to upload the admit card of the H.P.U.
 Examination 2023 and fee receipt of the fee deposited for the second installment of the previous year. Without these documents the application for the admission will not be considered.
- University Registration Number of candidates who are already registered with the HP University.

Admission Process for Under-Graduate (UG) Classes - Eligibilities Conditions

RULES FOR ADMISSION IN FIRST YEAR OF BACHELOR'S DEGREE COURSE

The admission to B.A., B. Sc. and B. Com. Courses will be done according to CBCS/NEP 2020 or/and as per guidelines issued by the Govt. of H.P./H.P. Univ/SPU Mandi.

GENERAL ADMISSION RULES:

- 1. Admission will be strictly on fulfillment of eligibility conditions.
- 2. Applicants who have passed Prabhakar are not eligible for admission.
- 3. Application form must be complete in all respects along with the following COLOURED SCANNED documents attached through ONLINE Mode:
 - (a) Self-Attested copy of detailed marks certificate of the 10+2examination
 - (b) Original Character Certificate from the institution last attended.
 - (c) Self-Attested copy of Matriculation certificate/date of birth certificate.
 - (d) Photocopy of Aadhar card
 - (e) To avail concession in tuition fee, Girl students must attach an attested copy of H.P. Bonafide Certificate.
 - (f) Candidates, coming from Boards/Universities other than HP Board of School Education / HPU Shimla, must produce migration certificate in original. Those who have passed first year / second year of a degree course from other than H.P. university will have to produce Equivalence Certificate from Himachal Pradesh University.
 - (g) Applicants must attach documentary proof for SC/ST/ OBC/ IRDP/BPL/ physically challenged (PWD) etc. and sports & cultural activities participation
- 4. A student must produce original certificates whenever asked to do so.
- 5. Rules for admission are subject to change as per HPU/SPU notifications from time to time.
- 6. Admission of a student is liable to be cancelled if he/she furnishes incomplete/wrong/false information or in case of concealment of facts. Disciplinary action will also be taken against such candidates.
- 7. Notwithstanding eligibility for admission, the Principal can refuse admission if the conduct of any student has not been up to the mark during past years.



- 8. Initially, all the admissions will be provisional (i.e., subject to approval by H.P./S.P. University).
- 9. A student can migrate from one college to another in accordance with the rules laid down by the H.P. University. However, such students must obtain the approval of the concerned Admission Committee.
- 10. Students seeking exemption from tuition fee for disability must attach an attested copy of disability certificate (Disability must be greater than 40%).
- 11. The Principal reserves the right to allow, disallow or cancel any admission at any stage.
- 12. Candidate seeking admission for the first time in this college must be accompanied by his/her parents/guardians to the admission committee.
- 13. Any gap in the academic career of an applicant must be supported by documentary evidence and self-undertaking.

1. ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS FOR ADMISSION FOR BA/B.Sc./ B. COM 1^{st} Year*

- a) Age An applicant must not be more than 23 years (25 years for girls) of age as on First July of 2023. However, in case of overage candidates, the Vice-Chancellor may allow age relaxation up to six months. In case of Scheduled Caste/ Scheduled Tribe students, relaxation in age up to three years is allowed as per rules.
- b) **Marks** A student who has passed 10+2 examination or an equivalent course can get admission in the first year of the three year degree course if he/she fulfills the eligibility conditions.
 - i) 33% of marks in 10+2 examination for applicant seeking admission in *B.A. 1st Year* provided he has passed English as subject in 10+2 level. For candidates opting for Mathematics as one of the subjects of study, percentage should either be 45% marks in aggregate or 45% marks in Mathematics at +2 level.
 - **ii**) 45% marks in 10+2 examination or an examination equivalent thereto of a Board/ University established by law in India with pass in four written subjects (three Science elective subjects & one English) for applicant seeking admission in *Bachelor of Science (Pass Course)*
 - iii) For applicant seeking admission in *B. Com. 1st year*, eligibility is 40% marks for those who have passed 10+2 from Commerce stream. However, it is 45% for other students provided they



- have studied Mathematics/ Economics as compulsory subjects at 10+2 level. It is 33% for Girl students.
- iv) If a candidate does not produce the actual marks certificate from a University/Board in respect of +2 examinations or equivalent examination where the result is shown in grades and standards etc. the minimum percentage of marks for each subject given in standards will be taken into consideration for determining their eligibility.
- v) A relaxation of 5% marks is given for SC/ST candidates seeking admission in B. Sc/B. Com. stream.
- c) An applicant having compartment in 10+2 will not be admitted.
- d) Admission in 1st year of B.A./ B.Sc. / B. Com will be done as per the 120-point Reservation Roster system or as directed by concerned authorities.

2. Extra Information

- a. Read instructions and eligibility conditions carefully
- b. Admission will purely be on merit basis. There are 80 seats in the first section and 60 seats in each subsequent section. The number of sections will be decided as per the availability of the faculty in the college.
- b. Students applying for admission should clearly mention their categories under which the admission is sought along with required documents.
- c. For B.A./B.Com. 1st year, the students can opt for 2 DSC courses and one compulsory course in English, for B.Sc. 1st year (non-Med.) students can opt for Physics, Mathematics, Chemistry /Computer Science and for B.Sc. 1st year (Med.), student can opt for Chemistry, Botany and Zoology and there will be no compulsory course
- d. Candidate, seeking admission in Sports/Cultural quota, must have position at state level in previous two years.

Note: Admission to 2^{nd} Year and 3^{rd} Year will be made on ROLL ON basis as per schedule mentioned in prospectus.

Reservations (Ordinance 3.1)

- (1) Admission to the various courses of study shall be open to all persons, irrespective of race, creed, caste or class subject to the following conditions: -
- (a) 15% and 7.5% of the seats shall be reserved for bonafide Himachali Schedule Castes and Schedule Tribes candidates respectively who have passed their qualifying examination (+2) from any institute/board located in Himachal or from any other board established by law in India which is equivalent to the qualifying examination (+2) as per H.P. University.
- **(b)** The remaining 77½% seats shall be filled as under: -
- i) 25% of the seats for admission shall be open for all the candidates irrespective of the Institution from where they have passed their qualifying examination;
- ii) 75% of the seats shall be filled out of the candidates who have passed their qualifying examination from H.P. Board of Education or any other board located in H.P., subject to the following reservations:
 - (a). 5% of the seats shall be reserved for outstanding sportsmen/women.
 - (b). 5% of the seats shall be reserved for outstanding cultural activists.
 - (c). 3% of the seats shall be reserved for Persons with Disabilities: 3% of the seats shall be reserved for Physically Handicaped candidates who are Himachal Pradesh Domicile.

In compliance to the judgment delivered by the Hon'ble High Court of Himachal Pradesh, on dated 04.06.2015, in CWPIL No. 30 of 2011, titled"Court on its own motion Vs. State of HP & others and instructions contained in Principal Secretary (Education) to the Govt. of HP, letter No. EDN-A-Kha(15)7/2019, dated 20-11-2010, it is directed that students with special needs with more than 40% disability, admitted in any course of study run in Govt. Colleges in Himachal Pradesh will not be charged any fees & funds.

Note: The admission to these reserved seats as stated above shall be made as per procedure/rules approved by the Executive Council and H.P. Govt. from time to time and prevalent at the time of admission process.

TIME LIMIT FOR THE DEGREE for UG Degree

- a) Regular candidate shall have to undergo the prescribed course of study in a college affiliated to the H.P./S.P. University for period not less than 3 academic years (and not more than 5 academic years) to pass the examination.
- b) For the degree (B.A. / B.Sc. / B.Com.) the student will have to cumulate a minimum of 132 successful credit hours of Course work for a bachelor's degree over a minimum of 3 years and maximum of 5 years from the date of admission.

MIGRATION

- 1. A student can migrate from one college to another after completing Year/Semester. However, students migrating from other colleges must obtain the approval of the concerned Principals. The admission will be granted only after the production of Migration Certificate and within time period as directed by university.
- 2. Students who migrate either from this college to any other or vice-versa must ensure that his record in University Students Management System/Examination System is transferred/rectified. To do the same he/she must consult the RUSA coordinator and concerned clerk.
- 3. Inter-Institutional Migration (i.e., from one college to another as well as from a college to ICDEOL and vice-versa) of students will be allowed when no-objection is obtained from both the relieving and receiving institutions, duly signed by both the Principals / Directors, to ascertain that the Major/Minor subjects being studied by the student are available in the receiving institution. The credits and grades earned will be carried over.

STUDENTS CONTINUOUS COMPREHENSIVE ASSESSMENT (CCA) AND EVALUATION PROCESS

All courses (Core, Elective and Ability enhancement) involve an evaluation system of students that has the following two components:

- 1) Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) accounting for 30%; and
- 2) EYE/Annual/End-Semester Examination (ESE) accounting for the remaining 70%.

NOTE: A student will have to pass both components (i.e., CCA & Annual Examination/ESE) separately to become eligible to be declared successful in a course.

1) Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA)

This would have the following components:



- **A)** Classroom Attendance: Each student will have to attend a minimum of 75% Lectures Tutorials / Practicals. A student having less than 75% attendance will not be allowed to appear in the Annual/End-Semester Examination (ESE).
- ⇒ Provided that those having between 74% and 65% attendance will apply for exemption in a prescribed form accompanied by clear reason(s) for absence to the authorized functionaries.
- ⇒ Provided that those having between 64% and 50% attendance will apply for exemption in a prescribed co-curricular activity (e.g. NCC, NSS, Youth Festivals, Sports etc.) to the extent of 25% (making the necessary attendance as 50% in these cases). However, the claim for this exemption should be supported by authenticated certificate from the concerned college authorities.
- ⇒ Provided further that those getting the exemptions, except for those getting exemptions for cocurricular activities, will not be entitled for getting the CCA marks for classroom attendance as given below:
- **⊃** Those having greater than 75% attendance (for those participating in Co-curricular activities, 25% will be added to per cent attendance) will be awarded CCA marks as follows:

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I) 75% to< 79% 1 mark
II) 80% to< 84% 2 marks
III) 85% to < 89 % 3 marks
IV) 90% to< 95% 4 marks
V) 95% & above 5 marks
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- B. House Exam/Class Tests
- C. Assignments/ seminars/ class test/ tutorials/ quiz

Note: Students enrolled from Academic session 2018-19 onwards CCA will account 30% of total marks for each course.

➡ It is approved that a student will have to pass both the components i.e., CCA and EYE (End Year Examination) separately (with at least 35% marks EACH in CCA, practical and EYE) to become eligible to be declared successful for the course.


2) Annual/End-Year Examinations (EYE)

The remaining 70% of the final grade of the student in a course will be on the basis of an **End Year Examination (EYE)** that will be for three hours duration and will cover the whole syllabus of the course. This examination will be held in the month of April/May.

National Education Policy - A Road for Better Education

The policy envisages a broad-based multi-disciplinary holistic education at the undergraduate level for integrated, rigorous exposure to science, arts, humanities, mathematics and professional fields having imaginative and flexible curricular structures, creative combinations of study, integration of vocational education and multiple entry/exit points. A holistic and multidisciplinary education will help develop well-rounded individuals who possess critical 21st century capacities in fields across the arts, humanities, languages, sciences, social sciences, and professional, technical, and vocational fields; an ethic of social engagement; soft skills, such as communication, discussion and debate; and rigorous specialization in a chosen field or fields. Such a holistic education shall be, in the long term, the approach of all undergraduate programmes, including those in professional, technical, and vocational disciplines.

Under NEP 2020, the undergraduate degree will be of either 3 or 4-year duration, with multiple exit options within this period, with appropriate certifications- a certificate after completing 1 year in a discipline or field including vocational and professional areas, or a diploma after 2 years of study, or a Bachelor's degree after a 3-year programme. The 4-year multidisciplinary Bachelor's programme shall be the preferred option since it allows the opportunity to experience the full range of holistic and multidisciplinary education in addition to a focus on the chosen major and minors as per the choices of the student.

Introduction To Choice - Based Credit System (CBCS)

> Preamble

Education plays enormously significant role in building of a nation. There are quite a large number of educational institutions, engaged in imparting education in our country. Majority of them have entered recently into semester system or annual system to match with international educational pattern. However, our present education system is churning out youth who have to compete locally, regionally, nationally as well as globally. The present alarming situation necessitates transformation and/or redesigning of system, not only by introducing innovations but developing "learner-centric approach".



Majority of Indian higher education institutions have been following the system which obstructs the flexibility for the students to study the subjects/courses of their choice and their mobility to different institutions. There is need to allow the flexibility in education system, so that students depending upon their interests can choose inter-disciplinary, intra-disciplinary and skill-based courses. This can only be possible when choice-based credit system (CBCS), an internationally acknowledged system, is adopted. The choice-based credit system not only offers opportunities and avenues to learn core subjects but also explore additional avenues of learning beyond the core subjects for holistic development of an individual. The CBCS will undoubtedly facilitate benchmarking of our courses with best international academic practices.

➤ Advantages of the choice-based credit system

- Shift in focus from the teacher-centric to student-centric education.
- CBCS allows students to choose inter-disciplinary, intra-disciplinary courses, skill oriented
 papers (even from other disciplines according to their learning needs, interests and aptitude) and
 more flexibility for students.
- CBCS makes education broad-based and at par with global standards. One can take credits by combining unique combinations. For example, Physics with Economics, Microbiology with Chemistry or Environment Science etc.
- CBCS offers flexibility for students to study at different times and at different institutions to complete one course (ease mobility of students). Credits earned at one institution can be transferred to another institution.

CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS) AT GLANCE

These courses aim to provide a paradigm shift in the national education policy seeking to bridge an increasing gap between an undergraduate degree and employability. The proposed curriculum endeavors to empower the students and help them in their pursuit for achieving overall excellence. Being the regulatory authority for higher education in India, the UGC constantly engages itself to suggest and facilitate the implementation of schemes and programs, which improves not only the level of academic excellence but also improves the academic and research environment in this country.

The main feature of the CBCS is to make undergraduate education student centric rather than system centric or teacher centric. For achieving these objectives, the CBCS strives to create a holistic syllabus. Thus in addition to dedicated focus on a discipline through core papers whether in an honors curriculum or a regular curriculum, elective papers have been added which will give students the freedom to choose the allied/applied/broad areas of their discipline and also the areas of other disciplines of their interest. Further in keeping with the vision of the

Government, special emphasis has been given to ability enhancement and skill development of students through elective courses under these domains which every student is required to study. However, in keeping with the spirit of CBCS here also the students will have complete freedom to choose these courses from a pool suggested by the UGC/Universities.

The CBCS provides an opportunity for the students to choose courses from the prescribed courses comprising core, elective and skill based courses. The courses can be evaluated following the grading system, which is considered to be better than the conventional marking system. Therefore, it is necessary to introduce uniform grading system. This will benefit the students to move across institutions both within India and across countries. In order to bring the uniformity in evaluation system and computation of the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) based on student's performance in examinations, the UGC has formulated the guidelines.

Outlines of Choice Based Credit System

- 1. *Core Courses*: The course designed for papers under this category aim to cover the basics that a student is expected to imbibe in that particular discipline. A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core course.
- 2. *Elective Courses*: Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.
- 2.1 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course: Elective courses offered under the main discipline/subject of study are referred to as **Discipline Specific Elective**.
- 2.2 *Dissertation/Project*: An elective course designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as supplement study/support study to a project work, and a candidate studies such a course on his own with an advisory support by a teacher/faculty member is called dissertation/project.
- 2.3 *Generic Elective* (*GE*) *Course*: An elective course chosen from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure beyond discipline/s of choice is called a *Generic Elective*. The purpose of this category of papers is to offer the students the option to explore disciplines of interest beyond the choices they make in **Core** and **Discipline Specific Elective** papers.
- 3. Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC): The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC). "AECC" courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement. These are: -



i. Environmental Science and


ii. English/Hindi/MIL Communication.

These are mandatory for all disciplines. SEC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.

4. *Practical/Tutorials*: One each with every core and discipline/generic specific elective paper.



Other Courses Running in the College

A. Master of Arts in ECONOMICS [Course Code: 601]

Schedule of admission to 40 seats in M.A. Economics will be displayed on the college notice board. The basis for admission to M.A. Economics shall be on merit in accordance with H.P. University guidelines.

Eligibility Conditions:

- a) Age limit as on 1st July 2021: 26 years for boys/ 28 years for girls/ 29 years for SC/ST candidates.
- b) Students seeking admission to M.A. Economics must have secured 45% aggregate marks in the subject of economics in three years of UG Degree or 50% aggregate marks in qualifying examination.

B. BBA [Course Code: 401] and BCA [Course Code: 501]

The college is also running self-financing courses - BBA (Bachelor in Business Administration) and BCA (Bachelor in Computer Applications). The prospectus for the aforesaid courses is printed separately and is available in the college office.

C. Carrier Oriented Professional Courses (Add-On Courses)

The college offers a carrier-oriented professional add on course on "Television and video Production". The aforesaid course has only 30 seats and only Bonafide student of the college irrespective of any stream can opt for this course at any stage of his /her degree i.e. 1st year or 2nd year or 3rd year. On completion of one year in the concerned add on course, student will get Certificate, on completion of two years in the concerned add on course, student will get Diploma and on completion of three years in the concerned add on course, student will get Advance Diploma. Interested students may contact Prof. Dinesh Kumar Assistant Professor in Journalism and Mass Communication.

The students of the college can make good use of this facility. The lab has back up facility for 3 hrs. provided by ONLINE UPS System.

LANGUAGES LAB

To usher the students into the competitive world, the College has established a Language Lab.

The basic purpose of the lab is to provide students a platform to enhance English language skills, communication skills and to practice soft skills. The main objectives of the Language Laboratory are:

- To equip the students with good communication skills.
- To emphasize the need of English in the technical world.

Learning a new language just by studying the theory is not enough to guarantee a successful language learning experience. Language labs provide practice in an entertaining and interactive

way to acquire the four main language skills: listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Students learn more comprehensively through a language lab.

SMART CLASS ROOMS

For effective teaching & Learning, the innovations are playing a dominant role. The use of digital equipments in the class room environment has led to the concept of *Smart Class Room*. A smart classroom uses smart class equipment like a digital board, projectors, computers, LED, etc., for **imparting quality education**. The audio/visuals displayed through the equipment are intriguing for students and helps build interest in them. It also works in sharpening the creative imagination of students. The College has developed a few smart class rooms for effective learning.



VIRTUAL CLASS ROOMS

There was pandemic time earlier due to spread of deadly CORONA virus and whole world had come to stand still. However to keep the wheel of education moving, a new concept of imparting the education- the **Virtual Class Room**, was developed. A virtual classroom is an online learning environment that **allows teachers and students to communicate**, **interact**, **collaborate**, **and explain ideas**. A virtual classroom enables students to access quality teachers anywhere on the planet so long as they both have a reliable internet connection. Our college has a virtual Class Room.



LIBRARY

The college library - "Heart and hallmark" of the institution, is doing a yeoman's job for its intellectual growth and development. Library is spacious with separate sections for text, reference books and generals. In addition to this the library is well equipped with modern facilities and resources in the form of text, online books, e-journals etc. The library is fully computerized using SOUL Software and RFID enabled automation giving an edge of services to the end users. It serves as an intellectual and cultural gathering place that fosters and enhances learning, education, research, and personal fulfillment. It has different sections for text-books and reference books. The library subscribes to approximately all leading newspapers (Hindi &English), magazines and journal for the benefit of students and teachers. Books are issued for the entire session to the needy and poor students on recommendation of the tutor. Library is also having a Book bank facility.

The books have been classified according to **Dewey Decimal Classification Scheme**. Library is a member of N-LIST (National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content) which opens the ways to online access to Full Text Electronic

Resources. Computers are installed in the library to access online reading material. Internet facility is also available for members in reading room.

RULES TO BE FOLLOWED IN LIBRARY

- a) Ordinarily two books are issued to undergraduate and three books to post graduate students at a time for 15 days and the librarian has right to recall the books as and when required.
- b) Reference books are to be used within the premises of the library only.
- c) In case of loss of a book, the member will have to either replace the book with fine or

pay fine in addition to the price of the book as applicable.

 d) Overdue charges are Rs. 1/- per day per book. Special fine may be imposed for long
 delays in return of borrowed item.

- e) Special fine shall be imposed for damaging the reading material or creating any disturbance in the library.
- f) No member shall be allowed to enter the library without having valid ID/ Library card
- g) Proper silence is to be maintained in the library.
- h) Use of mobiles is strictly prohibited.
- j) No eatable are allowed in the library.
- k) Loss of I-Card is to be intimated to the library. The holder of the card shall be responsible for the items issued on his/ her card. The Library/ ID card shall benontransferable.



HOSTEL

Our College is hub for the students belonging to many areas scattered in the Kangra District. To cater to their residential requirement, the College has a hostel for the women students coming from these far-flung areas. The College Girl's Hostel earmarked for Girls of SC Category have accommodation for 105 eligible students. Interested students may apply on a prescribed form (available in the office). It provides the boarders a peaceful and congenial environment to enable them to excel in their studies and personality development.

Shahid Captain Batra Birth Anniversary Celebration

Captain Vikram Batra, PVC (Posthumous), was an officer of the Indian Army who played a significant role during the Kargil War in 1999. He was born on September 9, 1974, in Palampur, Himachal Pradesh, India. Captain Vikram Batra's birth anniversary is celebrated on September 9th each year to honour his courage, sacrifice, and contribution to the country. The moto of birth anniversary celebration is summed up in the following line:

On this day we remember a hero so brave,

Captain Vikram Batra, his spirit we engrave.

Born on this earth with a heart full of fire,

He faced the enemy with unvielding desire.

During the Kargil War, Captain Batra led his troops fearlessly in several critical missions, displaying exceptional bravery and valour. He was instrumental in capturing Point 5140, also known as Point Batra, during the war. However, tragically, he lost his life while trying to rescue an injured officer during a mission on July 7, 1999.



ANNUAL PRIZE DISTRIBUTION FUNCTION

The starting point of all achievements is desire. To ignite the desire among the students, our College organises an annual event in the form of Prize Distribution Function. This function marks the culmination of literary and extra-curricular activities in a college. Prizes are awarded to inspire a healthy sense of competition among the students. Students are kept busy round the year in studies, games and sports and other literary activities like debates, essay writing, elocution and stage shows. Such event encourages them to aspire for excellence. Tutorial Groups - A Mini Help Desk

The youngsters have many problems in dealing with their student life. To provide assistance to these adolescents, our College has a tradition of Tutorial Groups. The basic purpose of the tutorial group is two-fold: **to promote students' development of group work abilities**, *such as social training and interpersonal skills* and **as a means to acquire academic knowledge**. Every student is assigned a Tutorial Group which normally consists of 70 to 80 students. Each group is guided by a member of the faculty who is their tutor. The students can seek advice of their tutor for all types of problems.

NCC – National Cadet Corps

N.C.C is National Cadet Corps. Its objective is to develop among the students a sense of *discipline, leadership qualities, friendliness and service-mindedness*. It is for the youth who



are school or college going. *NCC also aims* at creating a citizen level Second Line of Defense, providing a pool of talent, from which to draw new entrants to the Defence Services. Our college has two wings of NCC, one for **Girls** and one for **Boys**. The NCC is committed to its motto **"Unity and Discipline"**.

If the NCC Cadet chooses to appear for certificate examination, they will have to ensure 80% attendance in the Training programmes and the Camps.

acancies reserved for commission in Defence Forces for NCC 'C' Certificate holders:

(a) Army

IMA Dehradun: 25 Vacancies per course through UPSC and SSB interview.

OTA Chennai: 50 Vacancies per course for short service commission Non-Tech. UPSC exam, only SSB interview. 20% Vacancies reserved for girls.

(b) Navy

In Indian Navy, there are six vacancies per course. No UPSC exam, only SSB Interview. Two years age relaxation for NCC 'C' certificate holders.

(c) Air Force



In Indian Air Force, there are 10% vacancies in all courses including flying training courses. No AFCAT/UPSC exam, only SSB interview.

- (d) For other Ranks- 5 to 10 bonus marks awarded for recruitment.
- (e) Sailors & Airmen- 2 to 6 marks as additional credit points.

> NCC Scholarship Scheme

There are 1000 scholarships of Rs. 6000/- each. 250 vacancies out of total 1000 are reserved for cadets coming from rural/disturbed area only. The vacancies are allotted every year as per the enrolled strength of NCC Directorates.

NSS – National Service Scheme

National Service Scheme (NSS) was introduced in 1969 with the primary objective of developing the personality and character of the student youth through voluntary community service. 'Education through Service' is the purpose of the NSS. On 24 September 1969, the then Union Education Minister V.K.R.V. Rao launched the NSS at 37 universities all states. The motto of NSS is "Not me but you". It underlines that the welfare of an individual ultimately depend on the welfare of society as a whole. This express the essence of democratic living and upholds the need for selfless service and appreciation of other individual's point of view and also to show consideration for fellow human beings. Our college runs two NSS units of girls and boys consisting of 100 volunteers each. The students are enrolled in NSS on Merit basis. The students who attend 240 hours of social service and attend 7 days special camp are given a special benefit of 2% marks at the time of admission in PG courses by H.P. University.



ROVERS & RANGERS

Rangers and Rovers is a Movement for the young people of age 18 and above. The motto of the Movement is *Service to Society*. The purpose is to develop the young people as *Rangers and Rovers*, in achieving their overall physical, intellectual, social and spiritual goals, thus enabling them to become more responsible and duty bound individuals in society and communities. 
RED RIBBON CLUB

CAREER GUIDANCE AND PLACEMENT CELL

The career guidance cell **provides relevant academic and career information to enable Students to make informed decisions along the way.** Our focus is to provide opportunities in the areas of academic, career and personal/ Social development and to prepare students to meet their future challenges. Keeping in mind the career of students, the college runs a dynamic and vibrant *Career Guidance and Placement Cell*. The students are made aware of various career opportunities available to them. They are also advised about the preparation for various competitive examinations. In order to enhance communication skills and soft skills of the students, various activities are organized to make students confident enough to face interviews/group discussions. The Placement Cell helps students to procure not only jobs but also a career in many fields.

Extra-Curricular Activities

PTA plays a very vital role in the development and smooth functioning of the institution. There is a Parent Teacher Association which plans and undertakes developmental work in the college. The association is run by the Executive Committee which takes all decisions. The parents/ guardians of the students contribute towards PTA fund at the time of admission.

OLD STUDENTS' ASSOCIATION

One of the main purposes of Old Students' Association is **to support a network of former graduates who will, in turn, help to raise the profile of the College.** Our college is proud of its Old Students' Association (OSA), which plays a vital role in all the developmental activities of the college and its efforts are extremely commendable. The purpose of this association is to bring together old students on a common platform and work together for the betterment of the College.

EDUCATIONAL / STUDY TOURS

These tours provide the students with the opportunity of learning through travel, especially to places that they may not otherwise get to visit. Educational trips provide valuable



educational opportunities away from the classroom, without using textbooks and other tools which are used in a normal educational institution setting. Our college also provides this facility to the students with following terms and conditions:

- i) Educational tours are arranged only for final year students and such tours are allowed only during winter vacation. The routes will be recommended by the concerned committee and approved by the Principal.
- ii) Professors-in-charge or heads of departments should fix the itinerary with in-charge of tours.
- iii) The college will provide limited financial support as permitted under rules.
- iv) Students will have to produce written permission from their parents for joining such tours.
- vi) The college will not recognize any organization other than Central Student Association or Subject Societies as are established by college authorities.

CSCA- A STUDNTS' BODY

The students are the central focus of any educational system / institution, and their participation in its activities is undoubtedly essential within the overall perspective stated in the mission of the Institution. To achieve this, student body called CSCA is elected as per the norms and directions of H.P. University. It follows the recommendation of Lyngdoh Committee. The CSCA extends helping hand to the college administration in the smooth functioning of many activities.

The main functions of the CSCA are:

- 1. To ensure the maintenance of proper academic atmosphere and orderliness amongst the students.
- 2. To promote opportunities for the development of character, leadership, discipline and spirit of service among students;
- 3. To coordinate and integrate the activities of various committees / societies / clubs in the College;
- 4. To help in the organization of academic / cultural and sports activities in the College
- 5. To help in improving the living conditions in hostels and implementation of hostel discipline and rules framed from time to time to create conducive academic atmosphere free of violence and fear psychosis.



FEES/FUNDS/FINES

- a) Every student must pay his/her dues on the dates notified from time to time. A student will have to pay First Installment of dues at the time of admission and 2nd Installment will be collected in the month of December.
 - a) Failure to pay dues on due date will entail a fine of Re. 1/-per day.
 - **b)** In case of non-payment of dues, the name of the student will be struck off from the rolls at the end of that month.
 - c) Registration fee will not be charged from student migrating from another college if he is already registered with H.P. University. Other dues will have to be paid from the month of joining this institution provided student has not paid the dues in the college from which he has migrated.
- The name of a student will be struck off from the rolls of the college if he/she remains absent without leave for ten days or more in any class/subject (Theory/Practical).
- Every student will have to procure No Dues Certificate from the Library, NCC, NSS, Sports, Hostel, College Canteen, Fee Clerk, etc. if he wants to leave the college.
- 4. The Principal can expel a student from the college if he/she is found guilty of misconduct.
- 5. The security deposit will lapse if a student does not apply for refund of security within one year of leaving the college.
- 6. The fine imposed for absence has to be paid along with dues, while other fines have to be deposited by the date announced/fixed fot the same.

In case the name of a student is struck off for the first time the readmission is permissible within first 10 days with a fee of Rs. 100/- on the prescribed proforma, if name is struck off for the second time re-admission is done within 7 days with a fee of Rs. 200/- in the presence of the parents. After that no re admission is allowed. For the condition of 75% attendance, the lectures will be counted from 1st official teaching day.

LEAVE RULES

a) GENERAL LEAVE RULES:

- 1. Students can proceed on leave with prior permission. For this, they should fill in the leave forms to be supplied to the students (@ Rs. 5/- per booklet) at the time of admission.
- A tutor can recommend leave up to 6 days; for longer duration i.e. up to 10 days, a student must get the application signed by the Senior Tutor. In case Senior tutor is on leave, student must get leave sanctioned by the Tutor-in-Chief(Principal)
- 3. Leave during House Examination/Class Test will be sanctioned only by the Principal on the recommendation of the Senior Tutor.
- 4. Leave for sickness must be accompanied by a medical certificate.

b) DUTY LEAVERULES:

Participation by the students in Sports/Cultural/NSS/NCC/Co-Curricular activities, Inter College / University Competitions shall be considered as duty leave for the period of respective competition (s). Duty Leave, however, shall only be allowed if recommended by the concerned activity In-charge.

General Conduct and Discipline Rules

The college gives importance to discipline as it ensures growth and development of students. The Principal can impose fine, suspension or even rustication on any student who is found indulging in such misconduct as is listed below:

- i) Any act of ragging on the campus in or around the hostel will be severely dealt
 with. Ragging implies physical or mental-torture to another student or a group
 of students. Any student found associated in such nefarious activities will be
 held guilty of gross misconduct. Remember Ragging is cognizable offence.
 - ii) Any body found guilty of writing obscene language on blackboard, walls or furniture of the college.
 - iii) Aimlessly loitering in the verandas, raising noise or attempting to disturb classes.
 - iv) Smoking or consumption of alcohol/drugs etc. in the college hostel/ campus is



- strictly prohibited.
- v) Bringing unwanted outsiders to the campus or sitting unnecessarily on the passage of the hostel or within campus.
- vi) Playing in college premises without the permission the Principal.
- vii) Pasting posters on the walls or notices on the Notice Board without Principal's prior permission.
- 2. Mobile phone is strictly banned in the college campus. Anybody found using mobiles shall be fined minimum of Rs.100/-
- Student who intends to participate in sports or other curricular activities/educational tours must produce written permission from his/her parents/guardians.
- 4. Every student must always carry with him/her duly completed identity card which is issued to him/ her at the time of admission. He /She must produce the identity card of whenever demanded by any teacher or the Principal.
- 5. Parents/guardians are requested to remain in touch with the Principal and the concerned teachers regarding the progress of their wards in the college.
 - 6. Observance of the college rules and regulations is compulsory. Ignorance of the rules and regulations/orders issued from time to time is no excuse. Students are expected to go through the hand book of information and College notice board regularly.
 - 7. Students are expected to conduct themselves in graceful and dignified manner.
 - 8. Each student is expected to observe the descent dress code strictly.
 - 9. Each student is expected to be present regularly in the College (Expect during leave).
 - 10. No student is allowed to put poster in College campus/notice board, and to hold assembly in college premises or to address an unauthorized gathering on the college campus.
 - 11. Silence is to be strictly observed. Students causing disturbance/Obstruction in the smooth functioning are liable for disciplinary action.
 - 12. The students causing loss to the College property will be penalized and asked to make good for the loss.
 - 13. For other rules/regulations the students are directed to consult the College Prospectus and H.P. University Ordinance.
 - 14. Suppression of any information or furnishing any false information by a candidate will lead to immediate cancellation of his/her admission at any time. In such cases fee paid shall not be refunded.

- 15. The information given is an indication of the College/University's plans as on date of publication of this document. Details can be modified from time to time for academic and operational reasons. The students will be governed by latest regulations applicable to them.
- 16. In the event of any inconsistency in the rules for admissions/examinations or in the event of any clarification with respect to above said rules/instructions or any other matter, the decision of the Vice-Chancellor/Principal shall be final and no claim, what so ever, shall be entertained.
- 17. The Principal can impose fine, suspension or even rusticate any student who is found indulging in such misconduct as is listed below:
- 18. Students who participate in sports or other-curricular activities/educational tours must produce written permission from their Parents/Guardians.


