

## MULTIDISCIPLINARY ONE-WEEK WORKSHOP

### Inaugural Session

The inaugural session started with an introduction about the one-week multidisciplinary workshop and a brief introduction of the chief guest, Dr. N.N. Sharma, Pro Vice Chancellor, Sri Sai University, Palampur, by Dr. R.S. Chandel. Dr. Neena Sharma, convener of the Research and Development committee, gave detailed information about the 18 technical sessions of this one-week multidisciplinary workshop and welcomed the inaugural chief guest, Dr. N.N. **Topic:** Introduction to Computers and their systems

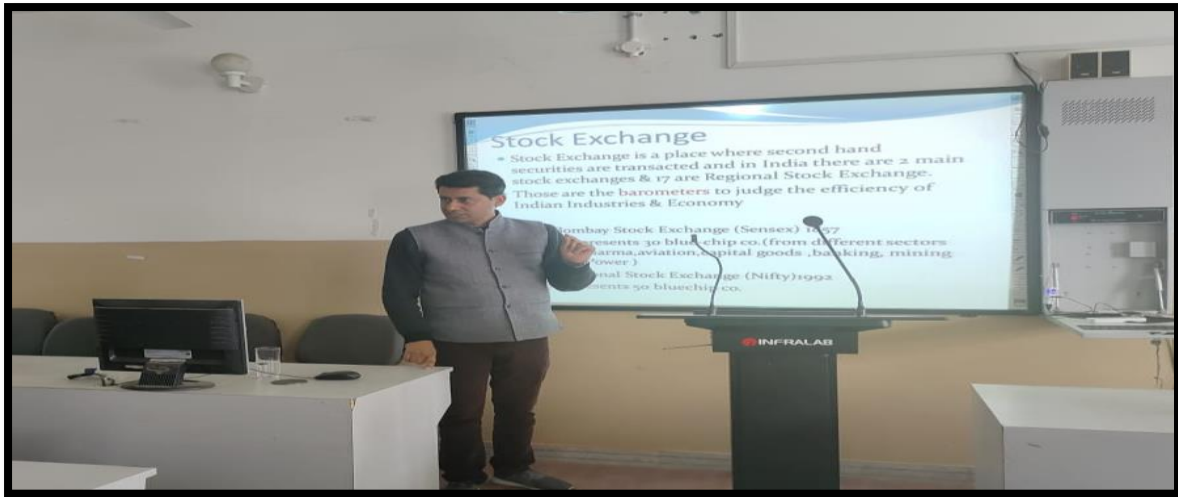
## **2<sup>nd</sup> Technical session (12:00pm – 1:30 pm)**

**Topic:** Digital payment in India: A comparative study of Pre & Post Demonetization period

**Resource person:** Prof. Nem Raj, Assistant Professor, SCVB Govt. College Palampur

One of the major objectives of Digital Payment is to achieve “**Faceless, Paperless, Cashless**” status. The promotion of digital payments has been accorded the highest priority by the Government of India to bring each and every segment of our country under the formal fold of digital payment services. He shared his views that after demonetization digital payment transactions have registered unprecedented growth in India. **Easy and convenient modes of digital payment**, such as Bharat Interface for Money-Unified Payments Interface (BHIM-UPI); Immediate Payment Service (IMPS), Person-to-Merchant (P2M) and NEFT/RTGS methods. He depicts that UPI has gone a long way in making digital payments a habit, and in firmly placing India on the track toward a cashless economy. He concluded that there is no doubt that the digital payment landscape in India has been transformed.

The session started with an introductory address about the topic by the resource person. There after the student team “Cardiac Rehab” was introduced to the audience. Team members, through a power-point presentation explained the causes, symptoms, preventive measures and treatment for the blood pressure (both high as well as low) and various heart diseases. Motive of the play was to tell everyone that how badly hypertension affects our health and mental peace. The blood pressure of all the visitors was measured by the members of the team cardiac

Rehab. Students had also display various charts and models containing tips to keep the heart healthy. A quiz, related to the information provided during the whole session, was organised afterwards and gifts were distributed to the students providing the correct answers. 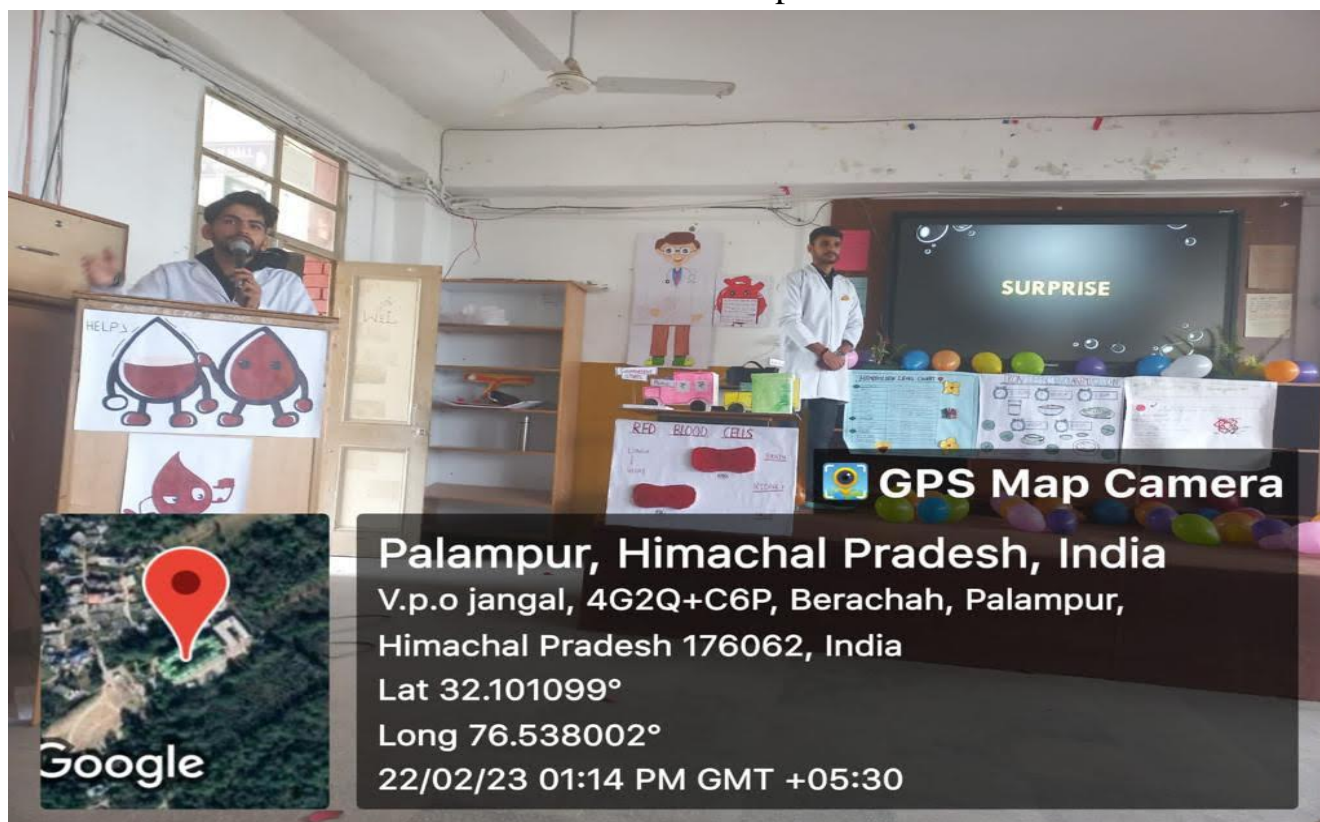
## **2<sup>nd</sup> Technical session (12:00pm – 1:30 pm)**

**Resource person:** Dr. Shivani, Medical Officer, PHC Banuri

**Topic:** Haemoglobin and Anaemia

At the onset of the session the resource person, Dr. Shivani, with her address apprised the audience about the functions of Haemoglobin in human body. About anaemia she explained, that how common it is in Indians, especially females. She also gave few important tips for a healthy lifestyle to prevent anaemia. Resource person's lecture was followed by the introduction of the student group "The Team Hb" who performed a play. Through the play students gave information about the causes, symptoms, prevention and cure of anaemia in a very fun and engaging manner. The resource person started the session with brief description of A, B, AB and O type blood groups found in humans. The student team “Blood Bar” was introduced to the audience thereafter. **Topic:** Human values

**1<sup>st</sup> Technical session (10:30am – 10:45 am)**

**Resource person:** Prof. Anuradha Sharma, Assistant Professor (Zoology),

**Topic:** Snake Bite

The last day of the one-week multidisciplinary workshop commenced with the first session based on the topic snake bite. Foremost the resource person gave a



brief introductory lecture on the topic. After the lecture, the resource person introduced the student team “The Serpents” to the audience. The presentation included lucid information about theme of the session such as, differences between poisonous & non-poisonous snakes, how to distinguish between the bite of a poisonous & a non-poisonous snake, why & how a snake bites, the poison apparatus of a snake, what to do when snake bites a person and much more. Thereafter a skit was performed by the students, which was basically aimed to explain the first aid methods that shall be employed during a snake bite. The team also demonstrated preserved specimens of common poisonous and non-poisonous snakes, to the audience for a live experience. Students had also displayed many posters and models. One of the models very cogently showed the mechanism of snake biting and flow of poison in snake fangs, which was specially appreciated by the audience. The team Serpents had also made a web page dedicated to the topic, which they showcased during the session. The team members, towards the end of the session, took up a quiz with the audience.
