


SCVB GOVERNMENT COLLEGE: A PROFILE

The college is named after martyr Captain Vikram Batra, the valiant son of Palampur. Since its inception the college has risen from strength-to-strength and carries a long magnificent history of its own. The college affiliated to H.P. University, Shimla, has been accredited B grade by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in Feb. 2020. The college has been running courses in all the three streams of Humanities, Commerce and Science since its inception. To cater to the changing educational needs, it also offers a master degree in Economics and self-financing professional courses like BBA & BCA besides <u>Add on courses on Television and Video Production</u>. The college provides congenial atmosphere for the all-round personality development of the students. SHERSHAH OF KARGIL

AMAR SHAHEED CAPTAIN VIKRAM BATRA



CaptainVikram Batra, PVC, "A Kargil War Hero", who at the age of 24 sacrificed his life for the Nation during Kargil war in 1999, is remembered by every Indian for his valour, courage and leadership qualities. Captain Vikram Batra was born on 9th September, 1974 to Sh G L Batra and Smt. Kamal Kanta Batra in Palampur. After completing his education, he joined IMA, Dehradun and was commissioned as a Lieutenant of the 13 J & K Rifles at Sopore in Baramullah.

Due to heroics of Captain Batra, India recaptured most significant peak – point 5140 from illegal possession of Pakistani soldiers in June 1999 followed by point 4750 and point 4875. While dragging Lt. Naveen back under cover, Naveen pleaded to Captain Batra to let him continue the fight in spite the injuries to which Captain Batra replied "Tu baal bachedaar hai!! Hatt jaa peeche," ("You have kids and wife to look after! Get back!"). He sacrificed his life during this rescue operation on July 7, 1999. He was awarded PVC on 15th August, 1999 posthumously.

Last words of Captain Vikram Batra were the battle cry "Jai Mata Di". His quote

"Ye Dil Maange More!" swept across the country and remains popular with millions of Indians & became a symbol of the indomitable spirit of Indian patriotism and Valour. "Ya toh Tiranga lehrake awunga, ya fir Tirange mein lipta huwa chala awunga, lekin awunga zaroor" (Either I will come back after hoisting the Tricolour (Indian flag), or I will come back wrapped in it, but I will be back for sure).

REGISTRATION FOR ONLINE ADMISSION

All new and old candidates must register and apply before last date and must read the "General Admission Rules" mentioned in prospectus.

All new and old candidates must register and apply before last date. New students seeking admission in first year can apply for three courses (Combinations) in order of preference in the application form. Student will be then allotted one of these courses (Combinations) on the basis of merit. The course allotted will be intimated through e-mail and you will have to deposit the fee (online) within the stipulated time. All the admission will be provisional subject to final approval by the university.

The Old Students seeking admission in 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} Year should choose all the courses (DSC's/DSE's) very carefully. All the admissions will be provisional subject to final approval by the university. For the final year students GE courses will be allotted on the basis of merit. Old students must mentioned their university registration number and must upload photocopies of receipt of 2^{nd} fee installment paid by them as well as admit card of previous class.

Before applying candidate must keep following documents/particulars handy:

- 1. A valid own Mobile number. Please keep it active, at least until the admission process is complete, as all communication will be sent through SMS/email.
- 2. Mobile number must belong to the candidate himself/herself or someone in the family. Do not fill in friend's or Cyber Cafe's Mobile number.
- 3. An e-mail ID belonging to the candidate or someone in the family.
- 4. Recent passport size photograph scanned in 150 x 190 pixel resolution and less than 250 Kb in size.
- 5. UID Aadhaar number or Enrolment number.
- SC/ST candidates who want to apply for scholarship must have a valid Aadhaar linked Bank Account with core banking facility. Please keep handy Bank Account number, Branch Name and Branch IFSC Code.
- 7. Detailed Marks Card of previous examination passed
- 8. University Registration Number of candidates who are already registered with the University
- 9. Candidates willing to apply for Reservation must have a valid supporting document.
- 10. Do not submit this Application printout in the college.
- 11. Candidates, whose name appears in the Cut-off list or to whom SMS or email for counseling is sent, must bring the all original documents and their photo copies at the time of counseling.

- 12. In the Registration Section please select the Course and Semester/Year in which you are seeking admission. Subject selection will be visible after you successfully register and Login into portal.

RULES FOR ADMISSION IN FIRST YEAR OF BACHELOR'S DEGREE COURSE

Admission to B.A. / B.Sc. / B.Com. first year of bachelor's degree will be according to the choice based credit system.

GENERAL ADMISSION RULES:

- 1. Admission will be strictly on fulfillment of eligibility conditions.
- 2. Applicants who have passed Prabhakar are not eligible for admission.
- 3. Application form must be complete in all respects along with the following documents:
 - (a) Self Attested copy of detailed marks certificate of the 10+2 examination
 - (b) Original Character Certificate from the institution last attended.
 - (c) Self Attested copy of Matriculation certificate/date of birth certificate.
 - (d) Two passport size photographs (one pasted on Library card and another on the admission form)
 - (e) A passport size photograph of the parents to be affixed on PTA membership form
 - (f) photocopy of Aadhar card
 - (g) To avail concession in tuition fee, Girl students must bring an attested copy of H.P. Bonafide Certificate.
 - (h) Candidates, coming from Boards/Universities other than HP Board of School Education / HPU Shimla, must produce migration certificate in original. Those who have passed first year / second year of a degree course from other than H.P. university will have to produce Equivalence Certificate from Himachal Pradesh University.
 - (i) Applicants must attach documentary proof for SC/ST/ OBC/ IRDP/BPL/ physically challenged and sports and cultural activities participation
- 4. A student must produce original certificates whenever asked to do so.
- 5. Rules for admission are subject to change as per HPU notifications from time to time.
- 6. Admission of a student is liable to be cancelled if he/she furnishes incomplete/wrong/false information or in case of concealment of facts. Disciplinary action will also be taken against such candidates.
- 7. Notwithstanding eligibility for admission, the Principal can refuse admission if the conduct of any student has not been up to the mark during past years.
- 8. Initially, all the admissions will be provisional (i.e. subject to approval by H.P. University).
- 9. A student can migrate from one college to another in accordance with the rules laid down by the H.P. University. However, such students must obtain the approval of the concerned Admission Committee.
- 10. Students seeking exemption from tuition fee for disability must attach an attested copy of 40%

disability certificate.

- 11. The Principal reserves the right to allow, disallow or cancel any admission at any stage.
- 12. Candidate seeking admission for the first time in this college must be accompanied by his/her parents/guardians to the admission committee.
- 13. Any gap in the academic career of an applicant must be supported by documentary evidence and self undertaking.

1. ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS FOR ADMISSION FOR BA/B.Sc./ B. COM 1st Year*

- a) Age An applicant must not be more than 23 years (25 years for girls) of age as on First July of 2021. However, in case of overage candidates, the Vice-Chancellor may allow age relaxation up to six months. In case of Scheduled Caste/ Scheduled Tribe students, relaxation in age up to three years is allowed as per rules.
- b) Marks A student who has passed 10+2 examination or an equivalent course can get admission in the first year of the three year degree course if he/she fulfills the eligibility conditions.
 - i) 33% of marks in 10+2 examination for applicant seeking admission in B.A. 1st
 Year provided he has passed English as subject in 10+2 level. For candidates opting for Mathematics as one of the subject of study, percentage should either be 45% marks in aggregate or 45% marks in Mathematics at +2 level.
 - 45% marks in 10+2 examination or an examination equivalent thereto of a Board/ University established by law in India with pass in four written subjects (three Science elective subjects & one English) for applicant seeking admission in Bachelor of Science (Pass Course)
 - iii) For applicant seeking admission in B.Com 1st year, eligibility is 40% marks for those who have passed 10+2 from Commerce stream. However, it is 45% for other students provided they have studied Mathematics/ Economics as compulsory subjects at 10+2 level. It is 33% for Girls students.
 - iv) If a candidate does not produce the actual marks certificate from a University/Board in respect of +2 examination or equivalent examination where the result is shown in grades and standards etc. the minimum percentage of marks for each subject given in standards will be taken into consideration for determining their eligibility.
 - v) A relaxation of 5% marks is given for SC/ST candidates seeking admission in B.
 Sc/ B. Com stream.
- c) An applicant having compartment in 10+2 will not be admitted.
- Admission in 1st year of B.A./ B.Sc. / B. Com will be as per the 120 point Reservation Roster system

2. ADMISSION PROCEDURE/INSTRUCTIONS TO FILL THE FORM

- a. Read instructions and eligibility conditions carefully
- b. Admission will purely be on merit basis. There are 80 seats in the first section and 60 seats in each subsequent section. The number of sections will be decided as per the availability of the faculty in the college.
- b. Students applying for admission should clearly mention their categories under which the admission is sought along with required documents.
- c. For B.A./B.Com 1st year, the students can opt for 2 DSC courses and one compulsory course in English, for B.Sc. 1st year (Non- Med.) students can opt for Physics, Mathematics, Chemistry /Computer Science and for B.Sc. 1st year (Med.), student can opt for Chemistry, Botany and Zoology and there will be no compulsory course
- d. Candidate, seeking admission in Sports/Cultural quota, must have position at state level in previous two years.

3. INTER-INSTITUTION MIGRATION*

Inter-Institutional migration (including from one college to another as well as from a college to the ICDEOL and vice versa) of students will be allowed when no-objection certificate is obtained from both the relieving and receiving institutions signed by their respective Principals/ Directors to ascertain especially that the major/minor/discipline specific course/elective courses being studied by the migrating student are available in the receiving institution. In such cases the credits and the grades earned by the student at the relieving institution will be carried by him/her to the receiving institution (detail will be provided by the relieving institution while furnishing no-objection for such migration) and will be added to the credits and grades that the student will be earning at the receiving institution. All the conditions and requirements for the degree including the time frame will remain as given above and other clauses of the regulations.

- a) Language Group: English, Hindi, Sanskrit.
- b) Social Science / Humanities Group: Economics, Political Science, Sociology, History, Geography, Physical Education, Public Administration, Mathematics, Education.
- c) Arts and Applied Social Science Group: Music, Journalism & Mass Communication, Public Administration, Tour & Travel.
- b) B.Sc. (Sciences / Physical Sciences / Bio-Sciences)
 - a) Natural Science Group: Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Geography, Mathematics.
 - b) Methods and Techniques Group: Mathematics, Computer Applications,
- c) B.Com. / B.B.A. (Commerce/ Management) a) Commerce, Management.

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5. CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS)

The main feature of the choice based credit system (CBCS) is to make Undergraduate courses student centric rather than system centric or teacher centric. For achieving these objectives the CBCS strives to create a holistic syllabus. Thus, in addition to focus on a discipline through core papers in general curriculum, elective papers have been introduced that will provide students the freedom to choose the allied/applied/broad areas of their discipline. Further, in keeping with the vision of the Government, special emphasis has been given to ability enhancement and skill development of students through elective courses under these domains which every student is required to study. However, in keeping with the spirit of CBCS the students will have complete freedom to choose these courses from a pool suggested by the UGC/ University. The CBCS provides an opportunity for the students to choose courses from the prescribed courses comprising core, elective and skill based courses. These courses can be evaluated following the grading system. This will benefit the students to move across institutions both within India and across countries. In order to bring uniformity in evaluation system the computation of the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) is based on student's performance in examination as per the UGC formulated guidelines.

6. DURATION OF THE COURSE

The UG (CBCS) programme for a regular student shall be for a minimum period of three years and a maximum of five years from the date of admission of the candidate.

7. COURSES IN PROGRAMMES

The UG(CBCS) programme in the college affiliated to the HPU will comprise the following categories of courses.

a. Core Courses b. Elective Courses c. Ability and Skill Enhancement Courses

- a. Core Course: A course which should compulsorily be studied by a student as a core requirement is termed as Core Course. Number of Core Papers for a General Programme in Science (B.Sc.) shall be 12 and for General Programme in Arts (B.A.) & Commerce(B.Com.) shall have 12 Core Courses each. Besides, there will be 2 papers each of English and Hindi/MIL in B.A./B.Com) as Compulsory Courses .The course designed for papers under this category aim to cover the basics that a student is expected to imbibe in that particular discipline.
- b. Elective Course: Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.
 - i) **Discipline Specific Elective** Course (2 each for regular courses): Elective courses offered under the main discipline/subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective.
 - ii) Generic Elective (GE) Course (2 courses each for B.A./B.Com. regular courses): An elective course chosen from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure beyond discipline/s of choice is called a Generic Elective. The purpose of this category of papers is to offer the students the option to explore disciplines of interest beyond the choices they make in Core and Discipline Specific Elective papers.

- c. Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECCs): "AECC" courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement. These are: Environmental Science, English Communication/Hindi Communication/MIL Communication. These are mandatory for all disciplines.
- **d.** Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)(4 for regular courses): SEC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc. These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge and should contain both theory and lab/hands-on/training/field work. The main purpose of these courses is to provide students life-skills in hands-on mode so as to increase their employability.
- e. An undergraduate degree in Science disciplines may be awarded if a student completes 4 core courses each in three disciplines of choice, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses, minimum 4 Skill Enhancement Courses and 2 papers each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective paper based on three disciplines of choice selected above, respectively.
- f. An Undergraduate degree in Humanities/ Social Sciences/ Commerce may be awarded if a student completes 4 core papers each in two disciplines of choice, 2 compulsory core papers each in English and Hindi/MIL, respectively, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), 2 papers each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective papers based on the two disciplines of choice selected above, respectively, and two papers from the list of Generic Electives papers.

- 2. For other core and elective papers, there shall be 3 theory classes. There will be 1 period for tutorial (per group)
- 3. For ICDEOL Students:

Internal Assessment/ Viva-voce/Practical/Live projects are not applicable to the ICDEOL students and the end year exam will be of 100 marks each.

8. STUDENT'S COURSE WISE CONTINUOUS COMPREHENSIVE ASSESSMENT (CCA) AND EVALUATION

All courses (Core, DSE, AECC & SEC) involve an evaluation system of students that has the following two components:

- a) Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) accounting for 30% of the final grade that a student gets in a course; and
- b) Annual Examination accounting for the remaining 70% of the final grade that the student gets in a course.

a) Continuous Comprehensive Assessment:

This would have the following components:

I. Classroom Attendance : Each student will have to attend a minimum of 75% Lectures / Tutorials / Practicals. A student having less than 75% attendance will not be allowed to appear in the annual Examination.

- Those having between 74% and 65% attendance will apply for exemption in a prescribed form accompanied by clear reason(s) for absence to the authorized functionaries.
- Those having between 64% and 50% attendance will apply for exemption in a prescribed form accompanied by a Medical Certificate from a Government Hospital.
- The exemption from 75% attendance will be given to those participating in prescribed cocurricular activities (e.g. NCC, NSS, Youth Festivals, Sports, etc.) to the extent of 25% (making the necessary attendance as 50% in the annual examination cases). However, the claim for this exemption should be supported by authenticated certificate from the concerned college authorities.
- Candidates who are getting the exemptions, except for those getting exemptions for cocurricular activities, will not be entitled for getting the CCA marks for classroom attendance as given below:

II. Classroom Attendance Incentive: Those having greater than 75% attendance (for those participating in Co-curricular activities, 25% will be added to per cent attendance) will be awarded CCA marks as follows (out of 5):-

- i) 75% to 79% 1 mark
- ii) 80% to 84% 2 marks
- iii) 85% to 89% 3marks
- iv) 90% to 95% 4 marks
- v) 95% above 5 marks

III. House examination

There will be one house examination, to be conducted when approx. 2/3 of the syllabus has been covered. This examination will be for 15 marks and will be conducted by the college in consultation with the teachers.

In laboratory courses (having only practical (P) component), the students will be tested on the basis of laboratory exercises given by the course teacher concerned. Rest of the procedure will remain the same as above. The remaining 10 marks of the CCA will be awarded on the basis of

seminar / assignment / term paper etc. that the course teacher might give to the students.

b) ANNUAL EXAMINATION

The remaining 70% of the final grade of the student in a course will be on the basis of an annual examination that will be for three hours duration and will be covering the whole syllabus of the course.

Note :

- i) Only those students will be allowed to appear in the annual examination who are successful in the CCA.
 - * A candidate who does not pass the annual examination in any course(s) or due to some reason is not able to appear in this examination, other conditions being fulfilled, and so is considered as 'Fail'), shall be permitted to appear in such failed course(s) in the subsequent supplementary/annual examination as per the instructions issued by HP University Shimla time to time.
 - * The registration for the annual examination will be done at the time of the enrolment for the course at the beginning of the session. The fee for the annual examination will also be collected at that time as decided by the university from time to time.
 - * A student, who fulfills all the requirements for appearing in annual examination, is unable to appear in the examination or to complete it on account of his/her own serious illness, accident, or on account of the death of near relative (mother, father, brother and sister), or the dates of state or national level examinations falls on dates of the annual examination may be allowed to appear in the annual examination in the next academic year. Permission to sit in the examination will be permitted by college Principal/Director on the production of a valid certificate/document from the competent authority. The college will send the name of the student to the Registration and Migration Cell for information.

OTHER COURSES

A. POST GRADUATE CLASSES IN ECONOMICS

Schedule of admission to 40 seats in M.A. Economics will be displayed on the college notice board. The basis for admission to M.A. Economics shall be on merit in accordance with H.P. University guidelines.

Eligibility Conditions:

- a) Age limit as on 1st July 2021: 26 years for boys/ 28 years for girls/ 29 years for SC/ST candidates.
- b) Students seeking admission to M.A. Economics must have secured 45% aggregate marks in the subject of economics in three years of UG Degree or 50% aggregate marks in qualifying examination.

B. BBA and **BCA**

The college is also running self-financing courses - BBA (Bachelor in Business Administration) and BCA (Bachelor in Computer Applications). The prospectus for the aforesaid courses is available in the college office.

C. Carrier Oriented professional Courses (Add-On Courses)

The college offers a carrier oriented professional add on course on "Television and video production". The aforesaid course has only 30 seats and only bonafide student of the college irrespective of any stream can opt for this course at any stage of his /her degree i.e. 1st year or 2nd year or 3rd year. On completion of one year in the concerned add on course, student will get Certificate, on completion of two years in the concerned add on course, student will get Diploma and on completion of three years in the concerned add on course, student will get Advance Diploma. Interested students may contact Prof. Dinesh Kumar Assistant Professor in Journalism and Mass Ccommunication.

SCHOLARSHIPS

The college offers various scholarships and awards to the students regulated by detailed rules available in the college office. Applications for these scholarships/stipends should be submitted to the college after the recommendation of the tutor. The college offers following scholarships/stipends/ awards:

- a) Government of India Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe Scholarships.
- b) Government of India Scholarship for the Handicapped.
- c) Low Income Group Scholarship. d) Poverty-cum-Merit Scholarship.
- e) Sainik Welfare Scholarship. f) Scholarship for the wards of Freedom Fighter.
- g) Scholarship for NCC Cadets.

IT LAB

The college has well equipped computer lab. It has fifty computers with internet facility and multimedia projector. The computer science students use the lab for practical purposes. The lab has back up facility for 3 hrs.

LANGUAGES LAB

A full-fledged Language Lab has been established with the purpose to facilitate enthusiastic students, who want to excel in communication skills in different Languages.

SMART CLASS ROOMS

Sixteen well equipped Smart Class Rooms have been developed in the college .It helps the students to conduct seminars, symposia by using modern gadgets.

LIBRARY

The college library 'Heart and hallmark' of the institution is doing a yeoman's job for its intellectual growth and development. Library is spacious with separate sections for text, reference books and generals. In addition to this the library is well equipped with modern facilities and resources in the form

of text, online books, e-journals etc. The library is fully computerized using SOUL Software and RFID enabled automation giving an edge of services to the end users. It serves as an intellectual and cultural gathering place that fosters and enhances learning, education, research, and personal fulfillment. It has different sections for text-books and reference books. The library subscribes to approximately all leading newspapers (Hindi &English), magazines and journal for the benefit of students and teachers. Books are issued for the entire session to the needy and poor students on recommendation of the tutor. Library is also having a Book bank facility.

The books have been classified according to Dewey Decimal Classification Scheme. Library is a member of N-LIST (National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content) which opens the ways to online access to Full Text Electronic Resources. Computers are installed in the library to access online reading material. Internet facility is also available for members in reading room.

RULES TO BE FOLLOWED IN LIBRARY

- a) Ordinarily two books are issued to undergraduate and three books to post graduate students at a time for 15 days and the librarian has right to recall the books as and when required.
- b) Reference books are to be used within the premises of the library only.
- c) In case of loss of a book, the member will have to either replace the book with fine or pay fine in addition to the price of the book as applicable.
- d) Overdue charges are Rs. 1/- per day per book. Special fine may be imposed for long delays in return of borrowed item.
- e) Special fine shall be imposed for damaging the reading material or creating any disturbance in the library.
- f) No member shall be allowed to enter the library without having valid ID/ Library card
- g) Proper silence is to be maintained in the library.
- h) Use of mobiles is strictly prohibited.
- j) No eatable are allowed in the library.
- k) Loss of I-Card is to be intimated to the library. The holder of the card shall be responsible for the items issued on his/ her card. The Library/ ID card shall be non-transferable.

HOSTEL

The college has a Girl's Hostel earmarked for Girls of SC Category having accommodation for 105 eligible students. Interested students may apply on a prescribed form (available in the office).

LEAVE RULES

a) GENERAL LEAVE RULES :

- 1. Students can proceed on leave with prior permission. For this, they should fill in the leave forms to be supplied to the students (@ Rs. 5/- per booklet) at the time of admission.
- 2. A tutor can recommend leave up to 6 days; for longer duration i.e. up to 10 days, a student must

get the application signed by the Senior Tutor. In case Senior tutor is on leave, student must get leave sanctioned by the Tutor-in-Chief (Principal)

- 3. Leave during House Examination/Class Test will be sanctioned only by the Principal on the recommendation of the Senior Tutor.
- 4. Leave for sickness must be accompanied by a medical certificate.

b) DUTY LEAVE RULES:

Participation by the students in Sports/Cultural/NSS/NCC/Co-Curricular activities, Inter College / University Competitions shall be considered as duty leave for the period of respective competition (s). Duty Leave, however, shall only be allowed if recommended by the concerned activity In-charge.

ANNUAL PRIZE DISTRIBUTION FUNCTION

Annual Prize Distribution function is held every year and Prizes are given to those students who show excellence in the fields of Academics, Sports, Cultural, NCC, NSS and other activities. The rules for the award of prizes will notified later on.

TUTORIAL GROUPS

Every student is assigned a Tutorial Group which normally consists of 70 to 80 students. Each group is guided by a member of the faculty who is their tutor. The students have to seek advice of their tutor for all problems. There are separate Senior Tutors for students of first year, second year and third year of each faculty (Science, Humanities and Commerce). Students have to get their Identity Card signed by the concerned Senior Tutor.

NCC

The college has two wings of NCC, one for Girls and one for Boys. If the NCC Cadet chooses to appear for certificate examination, they will have to ensure 80% attendance in the Training programme and the Camps.

Career in Defence Services

Vacancies reserved for commission in Defence Forces for NCC 'C' Certificate holders :

(a) Army -

IMA Dehradun: 25 Vacancies per course through UPSC and SSB interview.

OTA Chennai: 50 Vacancies per course for short service commission NonTech. UPSC exam, only SSB interview. 20% Vacancies reserved for girls.

- (b) Navy Six vacancies per course. No UPSC exam, only SSB Interview. Two years age relaxation for NCC 'C' certificate holders.
- (c) Air Force 10% in all courses including flying training courses. No AFCAT/UPSC exam, only SSB interview.
- (d) For other Ranks- 5 to 10 bonus marks awarded for recruitment.

(e) Sailors & Airmen- 2 to 6 marks as additional credit points.

NCC Scholarship Scheme

There are 1000 scholarships of Rs. 6000/- each. 250 vacancies out of total 1000 are reserved for cadets coming from rural/disturbed area only. The vacancies are allotted every year as per the enrolled strength of NCC Directorates. **The NCC is committed to its motto "Unity and Discipline".**

NSS

The college runs two NSS units of girls and boys consisting of 100 volunteers each. The students are enrolled in NSS on Merit basis. The students who attend 240 hours of social service and attend 7 days special camp are given a special benefit of 2% marks at the time of admission in PG courses by H.P. University. NSS is committed to its motto "Not me but you".

ROVERS & RANGERS

Rovers & Rangers is worldwide association of well disciplined volunteers. It has two wings, one for boys (Rovers) and one for girls (Rangers). The students can opt for Rovers and Rangers provided they are neither enrolled in NCC or NSS. The students are trained to serve community, society and humanity.

RED RIBBON CLUB

In order to increase awareness among students and public regarding AIDS, HIV and Blood Donation, the college has Red Ribbon Club. The club organizes on-campus interaction programme to educate and sensitize the college youth. Any student can get registered as volunteer of this club.

COLLEGE MAGAZINE - PALAM BHAV DARPAN

To hone the writing skills of the students, the college publishes an annual issue of the college magazine "**Palam Bhav Darpan''.** The magazine is edited by the Chief Editor and has six sections; each section is edited by a member of the staff and assisted by student editor.

CAREER GUIDANCE CELL AND PLACEMENT CELL

Keeping in mind the career of students, the college runs a dynamic and vibrant Career Guidance and Placement cell. The students are made aware of various career opportunities available to them. They are also advised about the preparation for various competitive examinations. In order to enhance communication skills and soft skills of the students, various activities are organized to make students confident enough to face interviews/group discussions. The Placement Cell helps students to procure not only jobs but also a career in many cases.

CULTURAL/CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

The college provides opportunities to students to take part in cultural and co-curricular activities such as Music (Vocal), Music (Instrumental), Debate & Declamation, Drama, Skit, Mime, Collage, Poster-making, Rangoli, Quiz, etc. A number of inter and intra college activities are organized the year around in which students harness and showcase their talents. Prize winners of HPU Youth Festival get the certificates which provide an additional preference at the time of admission to higher classes.

SPORTS ACTIVITIES

The college provides excellent facilities to sports persons who wish to make a mark in games. The disciplines in which the college prepares teams for university championships are: Athletics, Basket Ball, Hockey, Judo, Chess, Cross Country, Volley ball, Badminton, Cricket, Weight lifting, Kabaddi, Wrestling, Table-Tennis, etc. A committee of teachers decides the selection of teams to represent the college in different tournaments. The college sportsperson also have an access to gymnasium facilities.

No student of the college can play for an outside team without the written permission of the Principal.

PARENT TEACHER ASSOCIATION (PTA)

PTA plays a very vital role in the development and smooth functioning of the institution. There is a Parent Teacher Association which plans and undertakes developmental work in the college. The association is run by the Executive Committee which takes all decisions. The parents/ guardians of the students contribute towards PTA fund at the time of admission.

OLD STUDENT'S ASSOCIATION

The college is proud of its Old Students' Association (OSA), which plays a vital role in all the developmental activities of the college and its efforts are extremely commendable. The purpose of this association is to bring together old students on a common platform.

EDUCATIONAL / STUDY TOURS

- i) Educational tours are arranged only for final year students and such tours are allowed only during winter vacation. The routes will be recommended by the concerned committee and approved by the Principal.
- ii) Professors-in-charge or heads of departments should fix the itinerary with in-charge of tours.
- iii) The college will provide limited financial support as permitted under rules.
- iv) Students will have to produce written permission from their parents for joining such tours.
- v) The college will not recognize any organization other than Central Student Association or Subject Societies as are established by college authorities.
- vi) Application for educational tours must reach the Convener of Educational Tour Committee by15th December, 2019 and no application after that date will be entertained.

CSCA

The college student body called the CSCA is elected at the beginning of the every academic year as per the norms and directions of H.P. University. The CSCA extends helping hand to the college authorities in the smooth functioning of all activities and hold the image of the college always high in society.

FEES/FUNDS/FINES

- a) Every student must pay his/her dues on the dates notified from time to time. A student will have to pay dues for 1st quarter at the time of admission, 2nd quarter in Sept.
 - c) Failure to pay dues on due date will entail a fine of Re. 1/-per day.
 - d) In case of non-payment of dues in advance, the name of the student will be struck off from the rolls at the end of that month.
 - e) Registration fee will not be charged from student migrating from another college if he is already registered with H.P. University. Other dues will have to be paid from the month of joining this institution provided student has not paid the dues in the college from which he has migrated.
- 2. The name of a student will be struck off from the rolls of the college if he/she remains absent without leave for ten days or more in any class/subject (Theory/Practical).
- 3. Every student will have to procure No Dues Certificate from the Library, NCC, NSS, Sports, Hostel, College Canteen, Fee Clerk, etc. if he wants to leave the college.
- 4. The Principal can expel a student from the college if he/she is found guilty of misconduct.
- 5. The security deposit will lapse if a student does not apply for refund of security within one year of leaving the college.
- 6. The fine claimed for absence has to be paid along with dues, while fines imposed otherwise have to be deposited by the date announced.

In case the name of a student is struck off for the first time the re-admission is permissible within first 10 days with a fee of Rs. 100/- on the prescribed proforma, if name is struck off for the second time re-admission is done within 7 days with a fee of Rs. 200/- in the presence of the parents. After that no re admission is allowed. For the condition of 75% attendance, the lectures will be counted from 1st official teaching day.

CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

The college gives importance to discipline as it ensures growth and development of students. The Principal can impose fine, suspension or even rustication on any student who is found indulging in such misconduct as is listed below:

- i) Any act of ragging on the campus in or around the hostel will be severely dealt with. Ragging implies
 physical or mental-torture to another student or a group of students. Any student found associated in
 such nefarious activities will be held guilty of gross misconduct. Remember "Ragging is cognizable
 offence."
 - ii) Any body found guilty of writing obscene language on blackboard, walls or furniture of the college.
 - iii) Aimlessly loitering in the verandas, raising noise or attempting to disturb classes.
 - iv) Smoking or consumption of alcohol/drugs etc. in the college hostel/ campus is strictly prohibited.
 - v) Bringing unwanted outsiders to the campus or sitting unnecessarily on the passage of the hostel or within campus.
 - vi) Playing in college premises without the permission the Principal.
 - vii) Pasting posters on the walls or notices on the Notice Board without Principal's prior permission.
- 2. Mobile phone is strictly banned in the college campus. Anybody found using mobiles shall be fined minimum of Rs. 100/-
- 3. Student who intends to participate in sports or other curricular activities/educational tours must produce written permission from his/her parents/guardians.

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- 4. Every student must always carry with him/her duly completed identity card which is issued to him/ her at the time of admission. He /She must produce the identity card of whenever demanded by any teacher or the Principal.
- 5. Parents/guardians are requested to remain in touch with the Principal and the concerned teachers regarding the progress of their wards in the college.

THINGS TO REMEMBER

- 1) Every student must always carry with him/her duly completed identity card and he/she must produce it whenever demanded by any teacher or the Security Guard.
- 2) Every student must attend at least 75% lectures both in theory and practical separately failing which he/she will be debarred from appearing in university examination.
- 3) Internal Assessment will be awarded on the basis of House Examinations & Attendance and will be included in the Annual result.
- Any student representing the college in sports/cultural/NCC/NSS/Co-curricular activities must inform the concerned subject teachers.
- 5) It is for the information of students that ragging is not only a social evil but a punishable crime also.
- 6) There is complete restriction on bringing unwanted outsiders to the college campus. Cell/Mobile phone is strictly banned in the college campus.
- 7) Students must help the college administration in keeping the college campus clean and beautiful by making use of dustbins installed in the campus.
- 8) Students must not cause any damage to the college property. In case any damage is noticed, it will be recovered from the students.
- 9) Use of Chewing Gum, Gutka or any tobacco products in college campus is strictly prohibited.
- 10) Spitting in public places is strictly prohibited.
- 11) In case the name of a student is struck off for the first time the re-admission is permissible within first 10 days with a fee of Rs. 100/- on a prescribed proforma, if name is struck off for the second time re-admission is done within 7 days with a fee of Rs. 200/- in the presence of the parents. After that no readmission is allowed.



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
